# CLYDESDALE HARRIERS.

## Rules.

I.—That the Club be called the "CLYDESDALE HARRIERS."

II.—That the object of the Club be the promotion of Amateur Athletics generally, and Cross-Country Running in particular.

III.—That the general management of the Club be vested in a Committee not exceeding Twenty-Four Members, of whom Fifteen shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Club, including, at least, a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Captain, and Vice-Captain the remaining Members to be elected by the Committee and by the Sections (one from each section). Seven Members to form a quorum.

IV.—That each Candidate for election, upon filling up a form (on which the Rules of the Club are printed) declaring that he is an amateur, and that he will abide by the Laws of the Club and of the A.A.A., shall be proposed by one Member and seconded by another, after which his name will be submitted to the Committee, and, if agreed upon, passed. Any Member of Committee shall have the power of demanding a Ballot in the case of any Candidate. One black ball in four to exclude.

V.—That the Annual Subscription for Ordinary Members be Two Shillings and Sixpence, payable on the 1st of October in each year; Honorary Members, Five Shillings; and that the Subscription for Life Members be One Guinea. New Members' Subscriptions must be paid within One Month from the date of notice from the Secretary that their application has been passed, otherwise their election may be declared null and void.

VI.—That the Treasurer shall place before the Committee the names of all Members one month in Arrears for Subscriptions or other monies, the Committee then having the power to erase the names of such Members from the Books, as well as to enforce payment of such Subscription, and no one whose Subscription has been allowed to fall in arrears shall be entitled to any of the rights and privileges of Members of the Club.

VII.—That any Member intending to withdraw from the Club shall give written notice to the Secretary before the Annual General Meeting, or be liable for another year's Subscription.

VIII.—That any Member violating the Rules of the Club or of the S.A.A.A., or doing anything prejudicial to the interests of either, may be expelled from the Club by the votes of two-thirds of the full Committee.

IX.—That the uniform of the Club be Black Knickers and White Jersey, and that the Club Badge (a Horn and Whip, with the motto, "Excelsior") be worn on the left breast at Athletic Sports, and the Gate Badge on back at Cross-Country Runs. (Members are specially requested to enter under the name of the Club at Athletic Meetings.)

X.—That the Committee shall appoint an Advising Board of experienced members to confer with and advise the Secretary as to matters requiring to be dealt with by said Committee, and generally to watch over the interests of the Club. The Committee shall also allot the management of the Head-Quarters' Districts to certain of its members, who will look after said Districts and assist the Secretary and Treasurer so far as these are concerned, the Section Committees appointing their own District managers, and otherwise looking after the immediate business of their Sections. The Committee shall also appoint a Business Committee and any other Sub-Committees which they may consider advisable, and have full power to fill up vacancies in the General Committee and act for the Club (except to alter Rules), the majority in all cases to decide, the Chairman or President of the Club, however, having the power to appeal to a full Special General Committee Meeting. Proxies to be allowed at such Special Meetings only. That the Meetings of Committee be held on the first Thursday of each Month, or as near that date as possible, at least two days' notice to be given by the Secretary when, together with other current business, the Minutes of the Advising Board and of the Business and other Sub-Committees, as well as the Treasurer's Financial Statement up to the end of the previous month, will be read and considered.

XI.—That the Annual General Meeting be held early in September, and called by notice in at least one weekly athletic paper, and in one of the Glasgow evening newspapers not less than ten days before such meeting. The Reports of the Secretary and

Treasurer shall be submitted, and the Office-bearers and Committee (with Auditor to act in conjunction with one appointed by the Committee) appointed for the ensuing year. Twenty-five members shall form a quorum; a majority to decide. The Chairman shall have the power to appeal to a Special General Meeting on any special business, at which there must be fifty members, either personally or by proxy.

XII.—That a Special General Meeting may be called by the Committee, or by any ten members, or (in the above special case) by the Chairman on giving notice to the Secretary, who shall call the meeting in the same manner as the A.G.M.

XIII.—That these Rules be annexed to the Forms of Election and inserted in the Club's "Annual," and that no alteration in, or addition to, the Rules be made except at the Annual General Meeting, or at a Special Meeting called for that purpose. Ten day's notice of such alteration to be given to the Secretary.

### Cross-Country Regulations.

I.—That Cross-Country Runs be held on Saturdays, from the 1st of October to the end of February, or on such dates as the Committee may fix.

II.—That the Club when out for a run shall be under the management of the Captain or Vice Captain, or Senior Member of Committee present, who shall appoint a Pace-Maker and Whip for the control of each pack.

III.—That no one, when out for a run, shall be allowed to go ahead of the Pace-Maker, unless the run be a racing run, or the signal be given by the Pace-Maker for a race home.

IV.—That every member of the Club is expected to wear the Club Uniform at the Club Runs, and to support the management for the time being.





# EPITOME OF PAST SEASON'S WORK,

WITH

## Outline of Probable Programme for the Current Year.

The Committee of the Clydesdale Harriers, in submitting the "ANNUAL" for this, the fifth season of the Club, have to congratulate the Members on the steady progress and continued success of the institution during the past year, and trust that the general body of the Members will continue to loyally support them in their "labour-of-love" efforts to raise the Club, if possible, to a yet higher position in the athletic world, and to make it still more worthy of its ambitious motto, "Excelsior."

They would now simply draw attention shortly to the past year's work and the current season's prospects. The MEMBERSHIP at present stands at 631, or a nett increase of 112. The names of a large proportion of Members, however, have been written off the roll owing to UNPAID SUBSCRIPTIONS. A number of the defaulters had left the district, but the great majority had no excuse for not meeting their liability. The Committee having found that such Members, besides being not only altogether unprofitable, but also an absolute drag on the club, simply took their names off the roll; but it is their intention in future not only to do this, after fair notice, but also to enforce payment. It is hoped, however, that all Members will promptly pay their subscriptions to the Treasurer, who is very pleased to report that these are this year being paid very satisfactorily—no less than 100 having

already been received, although the present financial year is only a week old.

ORGANISATION.—A thorough system of organisation has now been perfected (see Rules, Committees, etc.), which will ensure smooth working, and enable the Committee to deal with a greatly increased membership, to which present Members are requested to contribute to the best of their ability.

CROSS-COUNTRY RUNS.—These last year were very well patronised, the record (82) secured at the Western Baths being closely approached several times during the season, particularly at the Maryhill Barracks run, when 77 athletes participated, the average turnout for the season being 60. Inter-club runs took place with all the principal clubs in the neighbourhood; but the most popular "meets" were from the various Private Baths and the Barracks, and these have again been secured for the current winter, which promises to be even more successful than ever, the opening run from Victoria Baths on 5th inst. being taken part in by no less than 120 athletes. This beats all previous records of *any club*, so far as we are aware, and it is hoped that a high average will be maintained throughout the year.

The past year was very fruitful in the bringing out and developing of *cross-country talent* of the very highest class, the best probably being J. W. M'Williams (Cross-Country Champion of Scotland), C. M'Caun (Scottish C.C.A. Champion), C. Pennycook (Scottish One Mile Champion), and Jack Wright (the "crack half-miler," but who was prevented by illness from taking part in *any* of the Championships). A great deal of this success is due to the *Cross-Country Handicaps*, of which there were four events, viz.:—(1) Five-Miles Novice Pedestrian, (2) Five-

Miles Novice Cross-Country, (3) Seven Miles and (4) Ten Miles Handicaps (open to the whole club)—all of which received fair support—besides other handicaps confined to Headquarters and to the various Sections. The Club Championship was this year won by J. W. M'Williams (Ayrshire Section); A. G. Colquhoun (Headquarters), being second; and C. M'Cann (Lanarkshire Section), third.

ATTENDANCE MEDALS.—These were last year gained by three members—Messrs. J. Marshall, jun., and John Giffen, of Headquarters, and Mr. R. J. Pollock, of Paisley—who attended every run. The Committee will be only too pleased to give a largely-increased number of such medals, so gained, at the end of this season—a long one, it will be observed.

CROSS-COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS.—The S.C.C.A. saw fit not only to maintain the nauseous restrictions of the preceding year, but to add to these; and your Committee, of course, could not see their way to support a body whose policy apparently aimed at its—the C.H.—dismemberment, if not ultimate destruction, and by no manner of means furthered the development and encouragement of the noble sport. As showing that we were still willing to meet the Association in a friendly way, under reasonable conditions: in addition to negotiations being opened for a political (in an athletic sense) conference, which were unfruitful, a representative team was sent from the club, it being distinctly understood, however, that this would be for the *last time*, unless this body saw fit to so alter its restrictive and prejudicial laws as to admit of the C.H. joining the Association, and taking its legitimate share of the management, due provision at same time being made for the amalgamation, or otherwise, with the Scottish Harriers' Union,

of which this club with its sections are at present the principal component parts. The *S.C.C.A. Club Championship*, as well as the *Individual Championship of the Association*, were both again easily won by this club, notwithstanding the absence of such men as Messrs. M'Williams (Scottish Cross-Country Champion), James Campbell (last year's S.C.C.A. Champion), Charles Pennycook (One-mile Champion), Duncan Campbell, A. M'Donald, and Abraham Russell, who all found it impossible to *again* take part in the contest, the competition for some reason or other being a complete failure at the first attempt on the previous Saturday. The following was the result on the deciding occasion:—

- (1) C. M'Cann (Champion); (3) A. Hannah, jun. (Club Captain); (5) A. G. Colquhoun (Glasgow C.C. Champion); (6) R. Graham; (7) W. Henderson (ex-Club Champion of C.H.); (9) A. Brown (Scottish Champion Walker).

The club result being:—(1) C.H. (Champions), 31 points; (2) E.H., 53 points; (3) W.S.H., 113 points.

It may here be mentioned that the general notion regarding this body's influence and powers are extremely exaggerated. The combined membership of the affiliated clubs and the area represented by them are very much less than that of the C.H. *alone*, and it is not in the slightest degree a ruling body over cross-country sport, its sole object being to carry out the above competition, which it will be seen will never be anything else than a contest between strong clubs having their head-quarters in large centres of population, and, being so unequal, will never be of any real interest. At present the *Clydesdale Harriers* are immensely stronger athletically than any other Scotch organisation, and should they retire from the contest the

Edinburgh Harriers will be equally superior to the other clubs, so that the so-called championship instead of fostering and encouraging sport is simply a deterrent to the development of cross-country talent, the younger clubs' chances of success being hopeless in such a competition. On the other hand,

THE SCOTTISH HARRIERS' UNION competitions are eminently calculated to develop and encourage the sport all over the country, and there are no unbiased or prejudiced restrictions to hamper the onward progress of the sport. The Championships under the auspices of this body are

(1), THE CROSS-COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIP OF SCOTLAND, which is absolutely open without any restriction whatever to all Scottish Amateurs, and this was won this year by J. W. MacWilliams, Ayrshire Section, Clydesdale Harriers (Four Miles Scottish Champion and record holder); A. G. Colquhoun (Glasgow) being second, and C. M'Cann (S.C.C.A. champion), third.

(2), A COUNTY CROSS-COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIP, which is open to all Scottish Counties. This enables good individual athletes in the smaller clubs, which, as clubs, would have no chance against the stronger organisations, getting the opportunity of assisting their county along with members of other clubs, and so helping to maintain the honours not only of their county, but also of their club. This competition has proved an extremely equal and interesting one, and well calculated to cement friendships between clubs, and to create enthusiasm for the sport which we have so much at heart. Last year six counties sent in teams of 10 men each, and until the race was actually

finished, no one could tell what the result would be, the competition being so keen and equal. The following was the result:—1, Glasgow—A. G. Colquhoun, 77m. 48s.; C. Pennycook, 79m 28s.; A. Brown, 82m. 12s.; W. Henderson, 83m. 30s.; G. M. Thomson, 84m.—average, 81m. 23 $\frac{1}{2}$ s. (Note, all these are C.H.) 2, Ayrshire—J. W. MacWilliams, 77m. 40s.; J. Brown (A.H.), 81m. 22s.; J. Blane (C.H., A.H., and K.H.), 83m. 45s.; A. Brown (A.H.), 85m. 10s.; A. Ramsay (K.H.), 87m. 5s.—average, 83m. 0 $\frac{1}{2}$ s. (Note, first and third are C.H.) 3, Lanarkshire; 4, Renfrewshire; 5, Dumbartonshire. The required number (5) did not finish for Stirlingshire; and Perthshire and Argyllshire were unable to raise full teams.

(3), COUNTY INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS. These Championships are open to all amateur athletes resident in their respective counties (Scottish), the first man in being reckoned the champion for the year, and receiving a handsome medal. The following is the result of the last year's Championships:—1, Ayrshire—J. W. MacWilliams; 2, Glasgow—A. G. Colquhoun; 3, Lanarkshire—C. M'Cann; 4, Renfrewshire—Abraham Russell; 5, Dumbartonshire—George Wright; 6, Stirlingshire—J. R. Scott; 7, Perthshire—A. Sime.

The S.H.U. will this year add a *Junior Championship*, to take place probably from Ibrox Park, Glasgow, on Saturday, 21st December, so that cross-country men who are not actual "cracks," should get into active training at once. The *winning team* will get magnificent gold badges; the second, silver badges; and the third probably certificates or some such like memento. In this competition the Clydesdale Harriers' Sections will be con-

sidered clubs, and it is anticipated that each will be able to send a representative team of 10 men, while Head-quarters may be able to raise two or more teams. There will also be an *Individual Championship*, open to all Scotchmen, the winner to be the junior cross-country champion of Scotland for the year, and will get a very superior gold badge, while suitable prizes will be presented to second and third men, in addition to any medals they may win as members of any of the placed teams. It must be understood that this event is not confined to boys and youths, but to *second-rate* cross-country men, who have not yet won their spurs at the sport. This Championship, it is expected, will develop a great deal of talent hitherto undreamt of.

The Committee intended sending a team to compete in the *National Cross-Country Championship* at London; but as the contests for the S.H.U., N.C.C.U., and S.C.C.A. Championships were fixed to take place on consecutive Saturdays, they were afraid of over-straining their men by giving them too much work, and considered it wiser to challenge the winners of the National Championship (the Salford Harriers) to a contest. This was accordingly done, and the challenge accepted; but the negotiations afterwards fell through, owing to some of the S.H. men having gone out of training. This year, however, the Committee have decided to send up the strongest possible team, properly trained, to endeavour to bring the blue ribbon of cross-country running north of the Border; and an enthusiastic supporter of the C.H. has offered a handsome trophy to be presented to the "first man in" in this contest, the value of said trophy to be doubled in the event of his being the absolute winner of the great event.

**ATHLETIC MEETINGS.**—The great majority of competitors this season belonged to this club, and as will be

seen from the list of prizes, they were very successful. Hannah received the club's medal for the highest number of wins—26. They were equally successful in the matter of records and championships, while many medals were awarded for time performances. The many handicaps confined to the clubs were largely taken advantage of. It is hoped that the same arrangement regarding the joint sports with our good friends the Rangers Football Club, will be carried through next season, at one of which some of the English cracks will be invited to show their paces against a representative team of Clydesdale Harriers. The following are the various results:—

(Note—Silver badges are granted for certain time performances.)

**CYCLING.**—This branch will be specially encouraged. Our cycling members, this season, were very successful, the best performance being perhaps in the "Pearce" Cup Competition, the first and second places being taken by R. A. Vogt and J. R. Wade respectively.

**FINANCE.**—The debit balance last year has been converted into a credit balance of £44 16s. 9d., of which the actual cash balance is £31 4s. 9d. Total income, £908 14s. 7d., comprised of £628 12s. 8d. from Sports, £188 0s. 5d. from Football Matches; Subscriptions, £60 9s. 6d.; while for Prizes for Handicaps, and Championship Record, etc., Medals, £88 19s. 6d. has this year been spent, and the outlay on Prizes for our Athletic Meetings has been £474 10s. 8d., and a total net profit of £205 16s. 10d. has been equally divided between the Clydesdale Harriers and Rangers.

A GYMNASTIC SECTION was formed last winter, and was most successful, the section being worked independently of the parent body, but as the Rosemount Gymnasium, in which the exercises were conducted, has this year been dismantled, they are temporarily without a home, but are in hopes of getting suitable premises very shortly, meanwhile.

**CLUB ROOMS** are being arranged for. At present there will be two rooms engaged—one as a Reading Room, where all kinds of athletic and other literature will be

supplied, and in which committee and other meetings will be held; while the other will be devoted to physical recreation.

GROUNDS WITH CINDER TRACK have been repeatedly spoken of, but so long as the present friendly relations are maintained with the Rangers F.C., the Committee consider that there is no necessity for moving in this matter.

A FOOTBALL TEAM has also been spoken of, but the time is not yet considered ripe for keeping up a permanent organisation, the present arrangement of getting up a strong team as opportunity offers being eminently satisfactory. We have been able, amongst other successes in this department, to overcome such strong bodies as the Preston North End, 3rd L.R.V., and Celtic F.C., although the former team last month succeeded in wiping out their previous defeat.

A JUNIOR SECTION has been very successfully established also under separate management, and a *Swimming Section* and *Cycling Section* are now spoken of. Members who have gone to London are arranging for the establishment of "The London Clydesdale Harriers," and are receiving substantial support from leading members of the "London Caledonians."

**CLUB MAGAZINE.**—As a means of better intercommunication between our Members, who are now scattered over the world, it is proposed to establish a Club Magazine, and although several leading members are willing to finance the undertaking, it is considered right to offer shares in the syndicate to any member of the Club. It is anticipated that the first number will be published about the beginning of next year, and meanwhile it is requested


