CLYDESDALE HARRIERS.

Rules.

- I.—That the Club be called the "CLYDESDALE HARRIERS."
- II.—That the object of the Club be the promotion of Amateur Athletics generally, and Cross-Country Running in particular.
- III.—That the general management of the Club be vested in a Committee not exceeding Twenty-Four Members, of whom Fifteen shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Club, including, at least, a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Captain, and Vice-Captain, the remaining Members to be elected by the Committee and by the Sections (one from each Section). Seven Members to form a quorum.
- IV.—That each Candidate for election, upon filling up a form (on which the Rules of the Club are printed) declaring that he is an amateur, and that he will abide by the Laws of the Club and of the S.A.A.A., shall be proposed by one Member and seconded by another, after which his name will be submitted to the Committee, and, if agreed upon, passed. Any Member of Committee shall have the power of demanding a Ballot in the case of any Candidate. One black ball in four to exclude.
- V.—That the Annual Subscription for ordinary Members be Two Shillings and Sixpence, payable on the 1st of October in each year; Honorary Members, Five Shillings; and that the Subscription for Life Members be One Guinea. New Members' Subscriptions must be paid within One Month from the date of notice from the Secretary that their application has been passed, otherwise their election may be declared null and void.
- VI.—That the Treasurer shall place before the Committee the names of all Members one month in Arrears for Subscriptions or other moneys, the Committee then having the power to erase the names of such Members from the Books, as well as to enforce payment of such Subscription, and no one whose Subscription has been allowed to fall in arrears shall be entitled to any of the rights and privileges of Members of the Club.

VII.—That any Member intending to withdraw from the Club shall give written notice to the Secretary before the Annual General Meeting, or be liable for another year's Subscription.

VIII.—That any Member violating the Rules of the Club or of the S.A.A.A., or doing anything prejudicial to the interests of either, may be expelled from the Club by the votes of two-thirds of the full Committee.

IX.—That the uniform of the Club be Black Knickers and White Jersey, and that the Club Badge (a Horn and Whip, with the motto, "Excelsior,") be worn on the left breast at Athletic Sports, and the Gate Badge on back at Cross-Country Runs. (Members are specially requested to enter under the name of the Club at Athletic Meetings).

X.—That the Committee shall appoint an Advising Board of experienced members to confer with and advise the Secretary as to matters requiring to be dealt with by said Committee, and generally to watch over the interests of the Club. The Committee shall also allot the management of the Head-Quarters' Districts to certain of its members, who will look after said Districts, and assist the Secretary and Treasurer, so far as these are concerned, the Section Committees appointing their own District managers, and otherwise looking after the immediate business of their Sections. The Committee shall also appoint a Business Committee and any other Sub-Committees which they may consider advisable, and have full power to fill up vacancies in the General Committee and act for the Club (except to alter Rules), the majority in all cases to decide, the Chairman or President of the Club, however, having the power to appeal to a full Special General Committee Meeting. Proxies to be allowed at such Special Meetings only. That the Meetings of Committee be held on the first Thursday of each Month, or as near that date as possible, at least two days' notice to be given by the Secretary when, together with other current business, the Minutes of the Advising Board and of the Business and other Sub-Committees, as well as the Treasurer's Financial Statement up to the end of the previous month, will be read and considered.

XI.—That the Annual General Meeting be held early in September, and called by notice in at least one weekly athletic paper, and in one of the Glasgow evening newspapers not less than ten days before such meeting. The Reports of the Secretary and Treasurer

shall be submitted, and the Office-bearers and Committee (with Auditor to act in conjunction with one appointed by the Committee) appointed for the ensuing year. Twenty-five members shall form a quorum; a majority to decide. The Chairman shall have the power to appeal to a Special General Meeting on any special business, at which there must be fifty members, either personally or by proxy.

XII.—That a Special General Meeting may be called by the Committee, or by any ten members, or (in the above special case) by the Chairman on giving notice to the Secretary, who shall call the meeting in the same manner as the A.G.M.

XIII.—That these Rules be annexed to the Forms of Election and inserted in the Club's "Annual," and that no alteration in, or addition to, the Rules be made except at the Annual General Meeting, or at a Special Meeting called for that purpose. Ten days' notice of such alteration to be given to the Secretary.

Cross-Country Regulations.

I.—That Cross-Country Runs be held on Saturdays, from the 1st of October to the end of February, or on such dates as the Committee may fix.

II.—That the Club when out for a run shall be under the management of the Captain or Vice-Captain, or Senior Member of Committee present, who shall appoint a Pace-Maker and Whip for the control of each pack.

III.—That no one, when out for a run, shall be allowed to go ahead of the Pace-Maker, unless the run be a racing run, or the signal be given by the Pace-Maker for a race home.

IV.—That every member of the Club is expected to wear the Club Uniform at the Club Runs, and to support the management for the time being.

V.—That Office-Bearers and Members of Committee wear distinctive badges at Club Runs.

FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

CLYDESDALE HARRIERS.

IN submitting this, their FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT, the Committee have endeavoured to lay before the Members of the C.H. an outline of the work that has occupied them since last Annual General Meeting, and of the various items on which it was necessary for them to deliberate and act on the Members' behalf during that period.

The financial position of the Club is satisfactory, as will be seen by the extract from the Treasurer's Report. The credit balance may not stand so high as at last Meeting, but this can be accounted for in various ways: the want of Football Matches; the want of an August Athletic Meeting (which last year contributed so much to the funds); and the expenses incurred at Birmingham in N.C.C.A. Championship.

ORGANISATION.—The system of organisation as established last season has been found to work well, and has been the means of increasing the Membership to a considerable extent, and at the same time secured a greatly-increased entry for Handicaps.

MEMBERSHIP.—The number of new Members admitted during the year has been 355, thus bringing up the Membership to 947. Of that number, however, no less than 258 have been marked off the Roll. These are composed of unpaid Subscriptions, Members who have left the District, but chiefly the resignation of the Paisley and

Falkirk Sections. The Membership on Roll at this date now numbers 689, making a nett increase during the year of 97.

SECTIONS.—These have also had a successful year. Paisley and Falkirk Sections have formed themselves into distinct bodies, having now a sufficient Membership to support Clubs of their own. It is pleasing to note that these are still on the most friendly terms with the parent body, and that many of their Members still retain their Membership. Dumbarton Section, under their energetic Secretary, has had a prosperous year; whilst Greenock, a new section which only started last November, rushed up with wonderful rapidity, until now their Membership is eighty strong, thanks to their enthusiastic and hard-working Secretary. The South Lanark headquarters has now been changed to Stonehouse. The Committee are considering the best mode of bringing Ayrshire section to a higher state of proficiency.

CROSS-COUNTRY RUNS.—Twenty-seven runs were held throughout the season, with an average attendance at headquarters of 53, or including the various Sections, of 116, every Saturday afternoon; the maximum attendance being at the opening run from Victoria Baths, when no less than 120 Athletes participated in it. *Four Badges* were given for best attendance, viz.: to Messrs James Marshall and J. C. Haig, of headquarters; and Messrs George Alexander and R. D. F. Paul, of the Paisley Section.

HANDICAPS.—Four, or rather five Handicaps were held. *A Five Mile Novice, Pedestrian*, at Western Baths, on 2nd November, which received a record entry

of 95, of whom 82 started. This was won by R. Findlay. *A Five Mile Novice and Open Handicap*, at Renfrew, on December 7th, with an entry of 84, of whom 75 started. Won by A. Hannah. *A Seven Mile Open Handicap* at Rutherglen, also won by A. Hannah; and a *Ten Mile Handicap and Club Championship*, at Western Baths, at which A. Hannah eclipsed all previous performances, and won not only the championship of the Club, but also the Handicap. Handicaps were also held amongst Members of the various Sections, and were the means of bringing out some good talent.

CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS.—The Scottish Harriers' Union held a *Junior Cross Country* Championship, at which eleven teams competed. Teams were entered from our various sections. The Individual Cross Country Championship was won by Jack Wright, and the Team Championship was won by Paisley; whilst Dumbartonshire secured second place. The following was the result:—

Hannah, although suffering from a severe cold, finished ninth—being comparatively close to the winner: thus proving that if our team had run up to their usual form the result would have been different.

SCOTTISH CROSS-COUNTRY ASSOCIATION CHAMPIONSHIP.—The S.C.C.A. Club Championship and Individual Championship were again easily won by our club, although Pennycook, M'Williams, D. Campbell, and Jack Wright were unavoidably prevented from taking

part in this competition. Hannah won the Individual Championship. It is gratifying to note that we have won this Individual Championship since the institution of that Association.

The team results being (1) C.H. (Champions), 34 points; (2) E.H., 44 points; (3) W.S.H., 137 points.

The S.H.U. and S.C.C.A. have now amalgamated, and formed a new association (the Scottish Cross-Country Union), which has received the support of the C.H.

An Individual Championship (Junior and Senior) open to all Scottish Amateurs, and a Junior and Senior Team Championship, open to teams of twelve men each, will be held during the season. The Junior Championship will be open to all who have never competed in any Senior Championship.

ATHLETIC MEETINGS.—At athletic meetings our racing men have been quite as successful. The Club's Medal, for the greatest number of prizes won, has not yet been decided. E. Campbell heads the list with a magnificent total of 33, composed of 15 firsts, 14 seconds, and 4 thirds. R. A. Vogt comes next, with a total of 25, including 11 firsts, 6 seconds, and 8 thirds. The following are the results of S.A.A.A. and N.C.U. Championships—Ten Miles Flat—1, A. Hannah (champion). Four Miles Flat—1, A. Hannah (champion). One Mile Flat—2, J. Blane. Half-Mile Flat—1, R. Mitchell

(champion). 100 Yards Flat—3, T. Maley. Three Miles Walk—2, A. Ramsay. One Mile Safety Bicycle—3, J. Mark. One Mile Ordinary Bicycle—1, R. A. Vogt (champion); 2, J. G. Torrance; 3, E. Campbell. Five Miles Safety Bicycle—1, J. Mark (champion); 2, J. Cockburn. Five Miles Ordinary—1, R. A. Vogt (champion); 2, J. G. Torrance. *Note*—The Club grants Special Silver Medals to members racing under the Club's name for winning championships.

RECORDS were also placed to the credit of the following members:—Half-Mile Ordinary Bicycle,—1 min. 19 3-5th sec., R. A. Vogt. Half-Mile, do., later in the season—1 min. 15 4-5th sec., R. A. Vogt. One Mile, do.—2 min. 44 2-5th sec., R. A. Vogt. Two Miles Flat—9 min. 43 2-5th sec., A. Hannah. *Note*—The Club grants Special Gold Medals to members racing under the Club's name for making records.

TIME BADGES have also been given for the following performances:—A. Hannah, in one mile, off 10 yards,—4 min. 32 2-5th sec.; James Logan, in one mile, off 30 yards,—4 min. 32 sec. Special Silver Badges are granted for certain time performances (see revised Table) to members racing under the Club's name. The number of badges given to our members for the various events amount in all to 55, of which 18 were gold and 37 silver.

CYCLING.—Every encouragement will be given to the cycling members next season. The 20 Miles Road Race Handicap and Championship, on the 11th inst., has received a large and class entry.

CLUB ROOMS were engaged last season, and were the means of bringing together a great number of the members. The Committee have again secured these rooms,

at 33 Dundas Street; it is hoped that the members will take due advantage of them. The rooms are open daily from 10 a.m. to 10.30 p.m., with the exception of Mondays when they are closed at 7.30 p.m.

FINANCE.—The Credit Balance this year is £12 14s. 10d. This is scarcely so large as last year, but this is easily accounted for by the fact of our sending a Team to compete in N.C.C.U., at Birmingham, at a cost of £39 3s.; dispensing with the aid of Football Matches; Rent of Club Rooms, &c. Total Income, £238 10s. 4d., comprised of £115 5s. 5d., from sports and handicaps; Subscriptions, £64 5s.; whilst the outlay for Handicap, Championship, Record and Attendance Badges has been £49 9s.

The Prospects of this season look more encouraging than ever. No less than 96 new members have been enrolled within the past five weeks. The combined efforts of the members have now raised this club to perhaps the strongest Athletic body in the Kingdom.

IN CONCLUSION, one word more. Let us bear in mind that Club and Committee are composed of Members, and that no individual member of the Club is excused from his share of the work. Why should we not, then, unite hand in hand, and, with the unselfish and true spirit of true Athletes, proceed steadily onward, surmounting every obstacle, and remembering that our motto is "Excelsior"?
