CLYDESDALE HARRIERS.

Rules.

I.—That the Club be called the "CLYDESDALE HARRIERS."

II.—That the object of the Club be the promotion of Amateur Athletics generally, and Cross-Country Running in particular.

III.—That the general management of the Club be vested in a Committee not exceeding Twenty-Four Members, of whom Fifteen shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Club, including, at least, a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Captain, and Vice-Captain, the remaining Members to be elected by the Committee and by the Sections (one from each Section). Seven Members to form a quorum.

IV.—That each Candidate for election, upon filling up a form (on which the Rules of the Club are printed) declaring that he is an amateur, and that he will abide by the Laws of the Club and of the S.A.A.A., shall be proposed by one Member and seconded by another, after which his name will be submitted to the Committee, and, if agreed upon, passed. Any Member of Committee shall have the power of demanding a Ballot in the case of any Candidate. One black ball in four to exclude.

V.—That the Annual Subscription for ordinary Members be Two Shillings and Sixpence, payable on the 1st of October in each year; Honorary Members, Five Shillings; and that the Subscription for Life Members be One Guinea. New Members' Subscriptions must be paid within One Month from the date of notice from the Secretary that their application has been passed, otherwise their election may be declared null and void.

VI.—That the Treasurer shall place before the Committee the names of all Members one month in Arrears for Subscriptions or other moneys, the Committee then having the power to erase the names of such Members from the Books, as well as to enforce payment of such Subscriptions, and no one whose Subscription has been allowed to fall in arrears shall be entitled to any of the rights and privileges of Members of the Club.

VII.—That any Member intending to withdraw from the Club shall give written notice to the Secretary before the Annual General Meeting, or be liable for another year's Subscription.

VIII.—That any Member violating the Rules of the Club or of the S.A.A.A., or doing anything prejudicial to the interests of either, may be expelled from the Club by the votes of two-thirds of the full Committee.

IX.—That the uniform of the Club be Black Knickers and White Jersey, and that the Club Badge (a Horn and Whip, with the motto, "Excelsior,") be worn on the left breast at Athletic Sports, and the Gate Badge on back at Cross-Country Runs. (Members are specially requested to enter under the name of the Club at Athletic Meetings.)

X.—That the Committee shall appoint an Advising Board of experienced members to confer with and advise the Secretary as to matters requiring to be dealt with by said Committee, and generally to watch over the interests of the Club. The Committee shall also allot the management of the Head Quarters' Districts to certain of its members, who will look after said Districts, and assist the Secretary and Treasurer, so far as these are concerned, the Section Committees appointing their own District managers, and otherwise looking after the immediate business of their Sections. The Committee shall also appoint a Business Committee and any other Sub-Committees which they may consider advisable, and have full power to fill up vacancies in the General Committee and act for the Club (except to alter Rules), the majority in all cases to decide, the Chairman or President of the Club, however, having the power to appeal to a full Special General Committee Meeting. Proxies to be allowed at such Special Meetings only. That the Meetings of Committee be held on the first Thursday of each Month, or as near that date as possible, at least two day's notice to be given by the Secretary when, together with other current business, the Minutes of the Advising Board and of the Business and other Sub-Committees, as well as the Treasurer's Financial Statement up to the end of the previous month, will be read and considered.

XI.—That the Annual General Meeting be held early in September, and called by notice in at least one weekly athletic paper, and in one of the Glasgow evening newspapers not less than ten days before such meeting. The Reports of the Secretary and Treasurer

shall be submitted, and the Office-bearers and Committee (with Auditor to act in conjunction with one appointed by the Committee) appointed for the ensuing year. Twenty-five members shall form a quorum; a majority to decide. The Chairman shall have the power to appeal to a Special General Meeting on any special business, at which there must be fifty members, either personally or by proxy.

XII.—That a Special General Meeting may be called by the Committee, or by any ten members, or (in the above special case) by the Chairman on giving notice to the Secretary, who shall call the meeting in the same manner as the A.G.M.

XIII.—That these Rules be annexed to the Forms of Election and inserted in the Club's "Annual," and that no alteration in, or addition to, the Rules be made except at the Annual General Meeting, or at a Special Meeting called for that purpose. Ten days' notice of such alteration to be given to the Secretary.

Cross-Country Regulations.

I.—That Cross-Country Runs be held on Saturdays, from the 1st of October to the end of February, or on such dates as the Committee may fix.

II.—That the Club when out for a run shall be under the management of the Captain or Vice-Captain, or Senior Member of Committee present, who shall appoint a Pace-Maker, and Whip for the control of each pack.

III.—That no one, when out for a run, shall be allowed to go ahead of the Pace-Maker, unless the run be a racing run, or the signal be given by the Pace-Maker for a race home.

IV.—That every member of the Club is expected to wear the Club Uniform at the Club Runs, and to support the management for the time being.

V.—That Office-Bearers and Members of Committee wear distinctive badges at Club Runs.

NOTES

FROM THE

Sixth Annual Report of the Club.

THE total Membership at last ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING was 689; this year it stands at 855, shewing an increase during the year of 166.

A new Section was formed towards the end of last Cross Country Season at Coatbridge, and carried on in conjunction with the older South Lanark Section, promises to fulfil the highest expectations. Dumbartonshire Section and the Greenock Section, thanks to their energetic Secretaries and Committees, are both in a flourishing condition, and anticipate a highly successful Season.

There were altogether twenty-seven runs last Season, the largest turn-out being at the Opening Run from Victoria Baths, in which 126 Members took part. The average attendance at Headquarters' Runs totalled 57·8, and including Sections 123·5, being an increase on the previous year. Attendance Badges were awarded to Messrs. Alex. Mitchell and Sam. Devine, who attended every Run throughout the Season.

Time Badges for certain performances on the track have been given to A. Hannah, W. Malcolm, and D. R. M'Culloch. The Club award Badges to Members racing under the Club's name at specified distances from stated

marks in a given time. (See Table and Conditions.) Last year something like £70 was expended for Badges for all events, a fact which speaks for itself.

Six handicaps were held throughout the Season, viz.:—

Five miles (Novice), Cathcart.

Five miles (Open), at Garscube Mill.

Five miles (Novice), at Garscube Mill.

Seven miles, at Western Baths.

Seven miles (Team Contest), at Victoria Baths; and

Ten miles Handicap and Club Championship at Govan, the latter of which was won by A. Hannah. Section Handicaps were also held at the various centres, and were well supported.

The S.C.C.U. Junior Cross Country Championship was held in Edinburgh in February last, our Team obtaining third place only. John Taylor's running in this race is worthy of special mention, he, after a most exciting finish, being placed second, and only a few feet behind the actual winner of the Individual Championship.

In the Senior Competition our men were again unfortunate, as although Hannah ran brilliantly and retained the honour of Individual Champion for another year, the Team could only manage second place, the result being determined by points. The placed men and their position in the race were as follows:—

- (1) A. Hannah, (5) Abraham Russell, (8) John Taylor, (9) A. G. Colquhoun, (10) T. A. Ferguson, and (11) J. R. Scott.

For the encouragement of our Cycling Members, a twenty miles road race—Championship and Handicap—

was held at Newton Mearns in October last year, at which James M'Laren won the Championship Honour, the Handicap being secured by R. M'Ewan. It has been decided to renew the event this Season about the same time as last.

Two Sports Meetings were held during the year, one in May at Barrowfield Park, and our usual Summer Meeting at Ibrox Park on 4th July. Unfortunately the first meeting had to be unavoidably postponed on account of the disagreeable nature of the weather; and, as a consequence, partly on this account, and owing to other circumstances over which we had no control, the postponed Meeting resulted in a financial loss. The Ibrox Meeting, however, was a huge success numerically, athletically, and financially, and enabled us not only to discharge all our debts, but to leave a balance at the credit of the Club.

At Athletic Meetings throughout the country our Members have, as in former years, done excellent work during the past Season, and numerous prizes have been won. Prominent amongst these may be mentioned Mr. R. A. Vogt, who has had a most successful Season, and who for the second time in succession carries off the Club's Badge for the greatest number of prizes won. Ex-Captain Hannah's performances too, especially in the earlier part of the Season, call for special mention, amongst others, the ten miles Flat Championship, in which he created records from the five miles upwards.

The Treasurer's Report shews a Credit Balance of £45 2s. od., the highest ever shewn in the history of the Club, a matter for congratulation. The total Income during the year was £412 3s. 10d., derived

from Subscriptions, Sports, and Handicaps, and the Expenditure, £367 1s. 10d.

In the coming Season, the prospects of which promise well, the Committee solicit the support and co-operation of every Member in furthering the interests of the Club, when and wherever opportunity occurs. This can be done in various ways, and particularly by inducing their friends to become Members, and so participate in the many benefits to be derived by being connected with the Club. It is universally admitted that a more invigorating or healthy pastime than Cross Country Running can scarcely be indulged in, and that it is daily becoming more popular, is evidenced by the fact that during the last three weeks eighty-five new Members have been enrolled. —
