CLYDESDALE HARRIERS.

Rules.

I.—That the Club be called the "CLYDESDALE HARRIERS."

II.—That the object of the Club be the promotion of Amateur Athletics generally, and Cross-Country Running in particular.

III.—That the general management of the Club be vested in a Committee not exceeding Eighteen Members, of whom Fifteen shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Club, including, at least, a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Captain, and Vice-Captain. One representative to be elected by each Section. Five Members to form a quorum.

IV.—That each Candidate for election, upon filling up a form (on which the Rules of the Club are printed) declaring that he is an amateur, according to the following definition:—An amateur is one who has never competed for a money prize or staked bet, or with or against a professional for any prize, or who has never taught, pursued, or assisted in the practice of athletic exercises as a means of obtaining a livelihood;—and that he will abide by the Laws of the Club, shall be proposed by one Member and seconded by another, after which his name will be submitted to the Committee, and, if agreed upon, passed. Any Member of Committee shall have the power of demanding a Ballot in the case of any Candidate. One black ball in four to exclude.

V.—That the Annual Subscription for Ordinary Members be Three Shillings and Sixpence, payable on the 1st of October in each year; and that the Subscription for Life Members be One Guinea. New Members' Subscriptions must be paid within One Month from the date of notice from the Secretary that their application has been passed, otherwise their election may be declared null and void.

VI.—That the Treasurer shall place before the Committee the names of all Members one month in Arrears for Subscriptions or other moneys, the Committee then having the power to enforce payment of such Subscriptions by legal proceedings, if necessary, and no one whose Subscription has been allowed to fall in arrears shall be entitled to any of the rights and privileges of Members of the Club.

VII.—That any Member intending to withdraw from the Club shall give written notice to the Secretary before the Annual General Meeting, or be liable for another year's Subscription.

VIII.—That any Member violating the Rules of the Club or of the amateur definition, as per Rule IV., or doing anything prejudicial to the interests of either, may be expelled from the Club by the votes of two-thirds of the full Committee.

IX.—That the uniform of the Club be Black Knickers and White Jersey, and that the Club Badge (a Horn and Whip, with the motto, "Excelsior,") be worn on the left breast at Athletic Sports, and the Gate Badge on back at Cross-Country Runs. (Members are specially requested to enter under the name of the Club at Athletic Meetings.)

X.—That the Committee shall allot the Management of the Headquarters' Districts to certain of its members, who will look after said Districts, and assist the Secretary and Treasurer, so far as these are concerned, the Section Committees appointing their own District Managers, and otherwise looking after the immediate business of their Sections. The Committee shall appoint any Sub-Committees which they may consider advisable, and have full power to fill up vacancies in the General Committee and act for the Club (except to alter Rules), the majority in all cases to decide, the Chairman or President of the Club, however, having the power to appeal to a full Special General Committee Meeting. That the Meetings of Committees be held on the first Thursday of each month, or as near that date as possible, at least two days' notice to be given by the Secretary when, together with other current business, the Minutes of the Sub-Committees, as well as the Treasurer's Financial Statement up to the end of the previous month will be read and considered.

XI.—That the Annual General Meeting be held early in September, and called by Circular. The Reports of the Secretary and Treasurer shall be submitted, and the Office-bearers and Committee (with

Auditor to act in conjunction with one appointed by the Committee) appointed for the ensuing year. Twenty-five members shall form a quorum; a majority to decide. The Chairman shall have the power to appeal to a Special General Meeting on any special business, at which there must be Thirty Members present.

XII.—That a Special General Meeting may be called by the Committee, or by any Ten Members, or (in the above special case) by the Chairman on giving notice to the Secretary, who shall call the meeting in the same manner as the A.G.M.

XIII.—That these Rules be annexed to the Forms of Election and inserted in the Club's "Annual," and that no alteration in, or addition to, the Rules be made except at the Annual General Meeting, or at a Special Meeting called for that purpose. Notice of such alteration to be given to the Secretary, not later than 1st September, or ten days previous to any Special General Meeting.

Cross-Country Regulations.

I.—That Cross-Country Runs be held on Saturdays, from the 1st of October to the end of March, or on such dates as the Committee may fix.

II.—That the Club when out for a run shall be under the management of the Captain or Vice-Captain, or Senior Member of Committee present, who shall appoint a Pace-Maker and Whip for the control of each pack.

III.—That no one, when out for a run, shall be allowed to go ahead of the Pace-Maker, unless the run be a racing run, or the signal be given by the Pace-Maker for a race home.

IV.—That every member of the Club is expected to wear the Club Uniform at the Club Runs, and to support the management for the time being.

NOTES

FROM THE

Eleventh Annual Report of the Club.

THE Membership presently stands at 490. As in former years, a considerable number of Members have had their names expunged from the Roll, owing to that most regrettable feature—the non-payment of their Subscriptions. At the end of last season the Committee took steps to put an end to this, and gave instructions to a Solicitor to collect all Subscriptions in arrears. This was the means of adding about Twelve Pounds to the funds of the Club.

We are sorry to report the death of Dr. Blatherwick, of Row, one of our Hon. Presidents, a gentleman who for many years has taken a great interest in the Club.

The number of Members admitted to the Club during the year was not so large as in former years, but this may be accounted for by the large number of Junior Clubs now in existence, picking up young members who do not care to join a Club of our standing.

The Reports from Dumbartonshire and Coatbridge Sections are very encouraging, and everything points to as successful a season as in former years.

Since last Annual General Meeting, the Greenock Section has thought it advisable to sever its connection with the Club, and is now known as the Glenpark Harriers.

Beginning with the Opening Run at Maryhill Barracks, twenty-three Runs, exclusive of the New-Year Run which took place at Ayr, and the usual weekly Evening Runs, were taken part in, and all were fairly well attended. Messrs. J. H. Smith, R. G. Murray, and A. Taylor (Headquarters), and Walter Brown, Jun. (Coatbridge Section), were presented with Badges for attending every Run throughout the season.

At the beginning of the season we introduced an innovation, so far as Scotland is concerned, in the shape of a Cross-Country Handicap, open to all Amateur Athletes. No fewer than eight Badges were given. James Girvan, Partick Harriers, winning the Handicap, and Andrew Hannah being first man home.

The results of the other Handicaps promoted by Headquarters were as follows:—

Five Miles (Novice), won by R. L. Weir; first man home, Walter Brown.

Five Miles (Open) won by Joe Bray ; first man home, William Robertson.

Seven Miles (Headquarters) won by Andrew Hannah ; first man home, Andrew Hannah.

Eight Miles (Open) won by Andrew Hannah ; first man home, Andrew Hannah.

Team Contest.—Won by Captain's Team ; Second, Vice-Captain's Team ; Third, Coatbridge.

Several Section Handicaps were also held during the season.

The Club Championship was won by Andrew Hannah, and the "Dick" Cup is now his own property, he having won it three times.

In the Junior Cross-Country Championship which was run at Hamilton, the Team which represented the Club tied for first place with the Motherwell Harriers, but on the race being re-run at Motherwell a fortnight later, our team secured first place, the placed men being A. McCallum, D. W. Mill, D. Jenkins, W. H. Whigham, Jas. M'Laren, and J. Stavert.

In the Senior Cross-Country Championship which was run at Edinburgh, we were again victorious, the placed men being Andrew Hannah, S. Duffus, Wm. Robertson,

D. W. Mill, E. L. Kelly, and Geo. Graham. Andrew Hannah, being the first man home, won the Individual Championship.

During the winter an attempt was made to clear off part of the debt by holding a Concert, but it was not the success anticipated, although a few pounds were made off it.

The Annual Sports were held at Ibrox Park on 13th June, and although the weather was all that could be desired, and the sport provided excellent, we only managed to make ends meet, owing to a Life-Boat Demonstration being held on the same day, a circumstance which the Committee foresaw, but could not avoid, the only alternative being to hold the Meeting on that day or not at all.

On the 20th July (Fair Monday), we introduced another innovation, in the shape of a Sports Meeting at the Coast. After due consideration, Dunoon was chosen as the venue, it being the only place a suitable field could be obtained, and although a goodly number turned out to witness the Sports, very little profit was made off them, owing to the expense incurred in putting the ground in order. The experience gained may be useful on another occasion.

During the past Athletic Season our Members have been very successful, the most noteworthy performances being Andrew Hannah's Ten Miles Championship, William Robertson's One Mile Championship, when he broke D. S. Duncan's long-standing Record, Stewart Duffus' Four Miles Championship, and Three and Four Mile Records, and Hugh Barr's Broad Jump Championship and Record.

The "Davidson" Trophy, run for at the Heart of Midlothian Football Club's Sports, was again won by our team, which consisted of Andrew Hannah, Stewart Duffus, William Robertson, and James M'Laren.

The Committee trust the Members will unite in assisting them by all means in their power, so that they may, by so doing, keep the Club in the honourable position it has always occupied in the Athletic World, and that the good feeling which has always existed between the Members may long continue
