CLYDESDALE HARRIERS.

Rules.

- I.—That the Club be called the “CLYDESDALE HARRIERS.”
- II.—That the object of the Club be the promotion of Amateur Athletics generally, and Cross-Country Running in particular.
- III.—That the general management of the Club be vested in a Committee not exceeding Eighteen Members, of whom Fifteen shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Club, including, at least, a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Captain, and Vice-Captain. One representative to be elected by each Section. Five Members to form a quorum.
- IV.—That each Candidate for election, upon filling up a form (on which the Rules of the Club are printed) declaring that he is an amateur, according to the following definition:—An amateur is one who has never competed for a money prize or staked bet, or with or against a professional for any prize, or who has never taught, pursued, or assisted in the practice of athletic exercises as a means of obtaining a livelihood:—and that he will abide by the Laws of the Club, shall be proposed by one Member and seconded by another, after which his name will be submitted to the Committee, and, if agreed upon, passed. Any Member of Committee shall have the power of demanding a Ballot in the case of any Candidate. One black ball in four to exclude.
- V.—That the Annual Subscription for Ordinary Members be Three Shillings and Sixpence, payable on the 1st of October in each year; and that the Subscription for Life Members be One Guinea. New Members' Subscriptions must be paid within One Month from the date of notice from the Secretary that their application has been passed, otherwise their election may be declared null and void.

VI.—That the Treasurer shall place before the Committee the names of all Members one month in Arrears for Subscriptions or other moneys, the Committee then having the power to enforce payment of such by legal proceedings, if necessary, and no one whose Subscription has been allowed to fall in arrears shall be entitled to any of the rights and privileges of Members of the Club.

VII.—That any Member intending to withdraw from the Club shall give written notice to the Secretary before the Annual General Meeting, or be liable for another year's Subscription.

VIII.—That any Member violating the Rules of the Club or of the amateur definition, as per Rule IV., or doing anything prejudicial to the interests of either, may be expelled from the Club by the votes of two-thirds of the full Committee.

IX.—That the uniform of the Club be Black Knickers and White Jersey, and that the Club Badge (a Horn and Whip, with the motto, "Excelsior,") be worn on the left breast at Athletic Sports, and the Gate Badge on back at Cross-Country Runs. (Members are specially requested to enter under the name of the Club at Athletic Meetings.)

X.—That the Committee shall allot the Management of the Headquarters Districts to certain of its members, who will look after said Districts, and assist the Secretary and Treasurer, so far as these are concerned, the Section Committees appointing their own District Managers, and otherwise looking after the immediate business of their Sections. The Committee shall appoint any Sub-Committees which they may consider advisable, and have full power to fill up vacancies in the General Committee and act for the Club (except to alter Rules), the majority in all cases to decide, the Chairman or President of the Club, however, having the power to appeal to a full Special General Committee Meeting. That the Meetings of Committees be held on the first Thursday of each month, or as near that date as possible, at least two days' notice to be given by the Secretary when, together with other current business, the Minutes of the Sub-Committees, as well as the Treasurer's Financial Statement up to the end of the previous month will be read and considered.

XI.—That the Annual General Meeting be held early in September, and called by Circular. The Reports of the Secretary and Treasurer shall be submitted, and the Office-bearers and Committee (with

Auditor to act in conjunction with one appointed by the Committee) appointed for the ensuing year. Twenty-five members shall form a quorum; a majority to decide. The Chairman shall have the power to appeal to a Special General Meeting on any special business, at which there must be Thirty Members present.

XII.—That a Special General Meeting may be called by the Committee, or by any Ten Members, or (in the above special case) by the Chairman on giving notice to the Secretary, who shall call the meeting in the same manner as the A.G.M.

XIII.—That these Rules be annexed to the Forms of Election and inserted in the Club's "Annual," and that no alteration in, or addition to, the Rules be made except at the Annual General Meeting, or at a Special Meeting called for that purpose. Notice of such alteration to be given to the Secretary, not later than 1st September, or ten days previous to any Special General Meeting.

Cross-Country Regulations.

I.—That Cross-Country Runs be held on Saturdays, from the 1st of October to the end of March, or on such dates as the Committee may fix.

II.—That the Club when out for a run shall be under the management of the Captain or Vice-Captain, or Senior Member of Committee present, who shall appoint a Pace-Maker and Whip for the control of each pack.

III.—That no one, when out for a run, shall be allowed to go ahead of the Pace-Maker, unless the run be a racing run, or the signal be given by the Pace-Maker for a race home.

IV.—That every member of the Club is expected to wear the Club Uniform at the Club Runs, and to support the management for the time being.

FROM THE

Twelfth Annual Report of the Club.

THE Membership now stands at 423. As has been the custom of former years, a number of Members have had their names deleted from the roll for non-payment of Subscriptions, though not until a strong effort had been made to exact payment. Since last Annual General Meeting, owing to the financial position of the Club, no resignations have been accepted until overdue Subscriptions and share of Club deficit had been paid. A special circular had been issued to all in arrears urging them to pay up, and this appeal met with a fair measure of success.

Upwards of sixty Members have been admitted since last year, showing the popularity of the Club to be actually on the increase.

The Dumbartonshire Section is reported healthy, but at the General Meeting of Coatbridge Section held on Friday night, 10th September, it was agreed, only two Members dissenting, to break connection with the Club.

The Opening Run was from Pollokshaws on 3rd October, and during a season of twenty-four Runs, closing with Milngavie on 27th March, very good attendances were had on almost every Saturday. Our Grand Cross-Country Handicap, open to all Amateurs, which is now looked forward to as an annual event, was held this season on 5th December, at Maryhill Barracks. James Palmer, Maryhill Harriers, was the winner of the Handicap, and Wm. Robertson was first man home.

Five Miles (Novice Handicap), Thornliebank, won by W. Lang, Coatbridge; first man home, R. Burns (Headquarters).

Five Miles (Open), Maryhill, won by H. D. Gow (Headquarters); first man home, Wm. Robertson.

Seven Miles (Confined), Thornliebank, won by Chas. Richards; first man home, R. Burns.

Team Contest.—Won by Captain's Team; Second, Coatbridge; Third, Vice-Captain's Team.

Eight Miles (Open), Thornliebank, won by J. Fraser.

Several Section Handicaps were held during the year, all of which filled well and were well contested.

The Club Championship was won this year by Stewart Duffus, being first man home in Team Contest.

In the Scottish Cross-Country Union Junior Championship which was run this year at Musselburgh, the Team representing the Club obtained second place, while A. Forrester, Coatbridge, ran third for individual honours. The Senior Championship was this year run at Paisley, and resulted in a double victory for the Club, Stewart Duffus securing the Individual Championship of Scotland, and the Team premier honours for the third time in succession. The placed men were as follows:—(1) S. Duffus; (2) W. Robertson; T. A. Ferguson; J. Stavert; D. F. Millmaker, and J. S. Duffus.

The Annual Sports were held at Ibrox Park on 3rd July, but the weather was anything but favourable, and had great effect on the gate, in consequence of which the Meeting resulted in a loss. Interest was added to the Meeting by putting up a Challenge Cup and Badges for Team Competition, and the Club's own Team were successful in winning.

Special thanks are due to the Committee of Rangers F.C. for their generosity in handing over to us the sum

of £10, being the major portion of the drawings of covered stand, which were to be retained by them.

Our Members have been very successful during the Athletic Season which has just closed. Principally to be mentioned are Wm. Robertson's winning the Ten Mile Flat Championship, and Hugh Barr's similar success in the Broad Jump. Wm. Robertson also succeeded in creating new figures for Three Miles, the record for which now stands at 14 min. 57½ secs.

From results such as given, it will be seen that the Club still occupies its accustomed position in the forefront of Athletics in Scotland, and the Committee desire the co-operation of the Members so that they may, by so doing, preserve the present high standing.
