CLYDESDALE HARRIERS.

Rules.

I.—That the Club be called the "CLYDESDALE HARRIERS."

II.—That the object of the Club be the promotion of Amateur Athletics generally, and Cross-Country Running in particular.

III.—That the general management of the Club be vested in a Committee not exceeding Eighteen Members, of whom Fifteen shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Club, including, at least, a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Captain, and Vice-Captain. One representative to be elected by each Section. Five Members to form a quorum.

IV.—That each Candidate for election, upon filling up a form (on which the Rules of the Club are printed) declaring that he is an amateur, according to the following definition:—An amateur is one who has never competed for a money prize or staked bet, or with or against a professional for any prize, or who has never taught, pursued, or assisted in the practice of athletic exercises as a means of obtaining a livelihood:—and that he will abide by the Laws of the Club, shall be proposed by one Member and seconded by another, after which his name will be submitted to the Committee, and, if agreed upon, passed. Any Member of Committee shall have the power of demanding a Ballot in the case of any Candidate. One black ball in four to exclude.

V.—That the Annual Subscription for Ordinary Members be Three Shillings and Sixpence, payable on the 1st of October in each year; and that the Subscription for Life Members be One Guinea. New Members' Subscriptions must be paid within One Month from the date of notice from the Secretary that their application has been passed, otherwise their election may be declared null and void.

VI.—That the Treasurer shall place before the Committee the names of all Members one month in Arrears for Subscriptions or other moneys, the Committee then having the power to enforce payment of such by legal proceedings, if necessary, and no one whose Subscription has been allowed to fall in arrears shall be entitled to any of the rights and privileges of Members of the Club.

VII.—That any Member intending to withdraw from the Club shall give written notice to the Secretary before the Annual General Meeting, or be liable for another year's Subscription.

VIII.—That any Member violating the Rules of the Club or of the amateur definition, as per Rule IV., or doing anything prejudicial to the interests of either, may be expelled from the Club by the votes of two-thirds of the full Committee.

IX.—That the uniform of the Club be Black Knickers and White Jersey, and that the Club Badge (a Horn and Whip, with the motto, " Excelsior, ") be worn on the left breast at Athletic Sports, and the Gate Badge on back at Cross-Country Runs. (Members are specially requested to enter under the name of the Club at Athletic Meetings.)

X.—That the Committee shall allot the Management of the Headquarters' Districts to certain of its members, who will look after said Districts, and assist the Secretary and Treasurer, so far as these are concerned, the Section Committees appointing their own District Managers, and otherwise looking after the immediate business of their Sections. The Committee shall appoint any Sub-Committees which they may consider advisable, and have full power to fill up vacancies in the General Committee and act for the Club (except to alter Rules), the majority in all cases to decide, the Chairman or President of the Club, however, having the power to appeal to a full Special General Committee Meeting. That the Meetings of Committees be held on the first Thursday of each month, or as near that date as possible, at least two days' notice to be given by the Secretary when, together with other current business, the Minutes of the Sub-Committees, as well as the Treasurer's Financial Statement up to the end of the previous month will be read and considered.

XI.—That the Annual General Meeting be held early in September, and called by Circular. The Reports of the Secretary and Treasurer shall be submitted, and the Office-bearers and Committee (with

Auditor to act in conjunction with one appointed by the Committee) appointed for the ensuing year. Twenty-five members shall form a quorum; a majority to decide. The Chairman shall have the power to appeal to a Special General Meeting on any special business, at which there must be Thirty Members present.

XII.—That a Special General Meeting may be called by the Committee, or by any Ten Members, or (in the above special case) by the Chairman on giving notice to the Secretary, who shall call the meeting in the same manner as the A.G.M.

XIII.—That these Rules be annexed to the Forms of Election and inserted in the Club's "Annual," and that no alteration in, or addition to, the Rules be made except at the Annual General Meeting, or at a Special Meeting called for that purpose. Notice of such alteration to be given to the Secretary, not later than 1st September, or ten days previous to any Special General Meeting.

Cross-Country Regulations.

I.—That Cross-Country Runs be held on Saturdays, from the 1st of October to the end of March, or on such dates as the Committee may fix.

II.—That the Club when out for a run shall be under the management of the Captain or Vice-Captain, or Senior Member of Committee present, who shall appoint a Pace-Maker and Whip for the control of each pack.

III.—That no one, when out for a run, shall be allowed to go ahead of the Pace-Maker, unless the run be a racing run, or the signal be given by the Pace-Maker for a race home.

IV.—That every member of the Club is expected to wear the Club Uniform at the Club Runs, and to support the management for the time being.

NOTES

FROM THE

Thirteenth Annual Report of the Club.

THE Membership now stands at 460, this figure including Coatbridge Section, which seceded from the Club bodily at the close of last year. However, it was deemed necessary to retain the Members individually on the Roll in view of the Committee's decision not to accept any resignations until the Club's finances be put on a firmer basis. In fact, no resignation of any Member of Coatbridge Section has been received throughout the year just passed. All other resignations have likewise been declined unless a proportionate share of the Club's deficit was paid.

Thirty new Members have been admitted during the Season.

Our only remaining Section—Dumbartonshire—is reported to be in a flourishing condition, and a considerable addition to the Membership is expected by the opening of the Cross-Country Season.

The Opening Run was this year held at Thornliebank Baths on 2nd October, and the Closing Run at Milngavie on 26th March, 1898. In all 24 Saturday Runs took place, and at all there was a satisfactory attendance of Members; the same also applies to the Evening Runs. Applications from John Stavert and J. Wilson for attendance badges for being present at every run on the cards were received, and the badges duly awarded.

Our Annual Grand Inter-Club Run Handicap (open to all Amateurs), which has become so popular, was run this year from Maryhill Schoolhouse on 11th December, and an innovation in the form of a Team Contest, open to runners who had never competed in the Senior or Junior Cross Country Championship, was added to the Competition. The result was as follows:—Winner of Handicap, Robt. Blair, Coatbridge Harriers; first man home, Wm. Robertson, Clydesdale Harriers. Team Contest:—1st,

Partick Harriers; 2nd, Olympic Harriers; 3rd, Celtic Harriers.

The following were the results of the other Handicaps promoted by Headquarters, all of which were held at Thornliebank Baths:—

Five Miles (Novice Handicap), won by Wm. Young.
Five Miles (Open Handicap), won by Geo. Johnston.
Seven Miles (Confined Handicap), won by A. Watson.
Team Contest, won by Captain's Team; 2nd, Vice-Captain's Team.

The Club Championship was won by Wm. Robertson, first man home in Team Contest.

As we were unable for various reasons to start our strongest Team in the Scottish Junior Cross-Country Championship, which was run this year at Hamilton Race Course on 12th February, our success was rather indifferent. Three of the Team, however, D. M. Cameron, J. Thyne, and A. Watson, were placed in the first dozen. We were successful in carrying off the Senior Championship, held at Musselburgh on 5th March, and although we lost the individual honour, our Team were

very well placed—Wm. Robertson (2), Stewart Duffus (4), J. S. Duffus (6), D. W. Mill (7), Geo. Brown (8), J. M'Laren (17).

The Annual Sports were held on 2nd July at Ibrox Park, which was kindly placed entirely at our disposal by the Rangers F.C. Once more fortune declined to favour us, and the Meeting was carried through in boisterous showery weather. The attendance was naturally of the most meagre description, and the income failed to meet the expenditure by about £25. Fortunately this sum was almost covered by a guarantee fund raised among the Committee and Members, so that very little loss on the Sports will attach to the Club.

The success of our Members on the path throughout the season must be very gratifying, particularly so in Team Contests, as the results at Watsonians and Berwick-on-Tweed Meetings will show. At the last named, the very handsome Challenge Cup presented by the ladies of Berwick being brought home.

We are this year very flush of Championship honours, viz.:—Half Mile, One Mile, and Ten Miles, Wm.

Robertson. Broad Jump and 100 Yards, Hugh Barr. Mr. Barr is to be congratulated when we look back on the many struggles he has made for the Sprint Championship, and the misfortunes which attended his efforts. In the Four Miles Championship we had two excellent representatives—J. S. Duffus, who finished 2nd, and W. Robertson, whose success was almost assured had he not run a stiff Half Mile and One Mile earlier in the afternoon.

These results all show that the high position of the Club is still being maintained, and the Committee are confident that the prestige of the Club can still be helped if every individual Member gives his support.


