CLYDESDALE HARRIERS.

Rules.

- I.—That the Club be called the "CLYDESDALE HARRIERS."
- II.—That the object of the Club be the promotion of Amateur Athletics generally, and Cross-Country Running in particular.
- III.—That the general management of the Club be vested in a Committee not exceeding Twenty-four Members, of whom Twenty shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Club, including, at least, a President, Vice-President, Two Joint Secretaries, Treasurer, Captain, and Vice-Captain. Five Members to form a quorum.
- IV.—That each Candidate for election sends with his application the Subscription for the first year, which will be returned if he is not elected; and the Candidate must also make the declaration that he is an Amateur, according to the following definition:—"An amateur is one who has never competed for a money prize or monetary consideration, or for any declared wager or staked bet; who has never engaged in, assisted in, or taught any athletic exercises as a means of pecuniary gain; and who has never taken part in any competition with any one who is not an amateur";—and that he will abide by the Laws of the Club, shall be proposed by one Member and seconded by another, after which his name will be submitted to the Committee, and, if agreed upon, passed. Any Member of Committee shall have the power of demanding a Ballot in the case of any Candidate. One black ball in four to exclude.
- V.—That the Annual Subscription for Ordinary Members be Three Shillings and Sixpence (for Honorary Members, Five Shillings), payable on the 1st of October in each year; and that the Subscription for Life Members be One Guinea.

VI.—That the Treasurer shall place before the Committee the names of all Members one month in Arrears for Subscriptions or other moneys, the Committee then having the power to enforce payment of such by legal proceedings, if necessary, and no one whose Subscription has been allowed to fall in arrears shall be entitled to any of the rights and privileges of Members of the Club.

VII.—That any Member intending to withdraw from the Club shall give written notice to the Secretary before the Annual General Meeting, or be liable for another year's Subscription.

VIII.—That any Member violating the Rules of the Club or of the amateur definition, as per Rule IV., or doing anything prejudicial to the interests of either, may be expelled from the Club by the votes of two-thirds of the full Committee.

IX.—That the uniform of the Club be Black Knickers and White Jersey with Black Facings and the letter "C" in black on front and back. (Members are specially requested to enter under the name of the Club at Athletic Meetings.)

X.—For the purpose of administration the Committee may subdivide the Membership into Headquarters Districts, and allot the management of those to certain of its members who shall be termed District Conveners, and who shall look after said Districts, and assist the Secretaries and Treasurer as far as these are concerned. The Committee shall appoint any Sub-Committees which they may consider advisable, and have full power to fill up vacancies in the General Committee and act for the Club (except to alter Rules), the majority in all cases to decide, the Chairman or President of the Club, however, having the power to appeal to a full Special General Committee Meeting. That the Meetings of Committees be held on the first Monday of each month, or as near that date as possible, at least two days' notice to be given by the Secretary when, together with other current business, the Minutes of the Sub-Committees, as well as the Treasurer's Financial Statement up to the end of the previous month will be read and considered.

XI.—That the Annual General Meeting be held early in September, and called by Circular. The Reports of the Secretaries and Treasurer shall be submitted, and the Office-bearers and Committee (with

Auditor to act in conjunction with one appointed by the Committee) appointed for the ensuing year. Fifteen members shall form a quorum: a majority to decide. The Chairman shall have the power to appeal to a Special General Meeting on any special business, at which there must be Twenty Members present.

XII.—That a Special General Meeting may be called by the Committee, or by any Ten Members, or (in the above special case) by the Chairman on giving notice to the Secretary, who shall call the meeting in the same manner as the A.G.M.

XIII.—That these Rules be inserted in the Club's "Annual," and that no alteration in, or addition to, the Rules be made except at the Annual General Meeting, or at a Special Meeting called for that purpose. Notice of such alteration to be given to the Secretary, not later than 1st September, or ten days previous to any Special General Meeting.

Cross-Country Regulations.

I.—That Cross-Country Runs be held on Saturdays, from the 1st of October to the end of March, or on such dates as the Committee may fix.

II.—That the Club when out for a run shall be under the management of the Captain or Vice-Captain, or Senior Member of Committee present, who shall appoint a Pace-Maker and Whip for the control of each pack.

III.—That no one, when out for a run, shall be allowed to go ahead of the Pace-Maker, unless the run be a racing run, or the signal be given by the Pace-Maker for a race home.

IV.—That every member of the Club is expected to wear the Club Uniform at the Club Runs, and to support the management for the time being.

NOTES FROM THE
TWENTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CLUB.

THE Cross-Country season opened at Thornliebank Baths, on 1st October, 1910, and continued until 18th March, 1911.

Inter-Club Runs were held with the following Clubs—Paisley Harriers, Renfrew Y.M.C.A. Harriers, Glenpark Harriers, Maryhill Harriers, Shettleston Harriers, Babcock and Wilcox Harriers, Garscube Harriers, and Bellahouston Harriers.

The various Handicaps held throughout the season resulted as follows:—

Five Miles Novice Handicap—1st, James Hughes; 2nd, John McCormack; 3rd, T. B. Erskine. Handicap result—J. McCormack, T. B. Erskine, S. Jamieson.

Five Miles Handicap—1st, Robt. Frew. Handicap result—Alex. Loch, F. McCormack, Peter McLean.

Club Championship and Team Race—1st, Alex. McPhee, Junr.; 2nd, S. S. Watt; 3rd, G. Findlay. The placed men in the winning team were—A. McPhee, Junr., Wm. Lough and Peter McLean.

Seven Miles Handicap—1st, S. S. Watt; 2nd, Jas. McGhie; 3rd, A. I. Simpson; 4th, Alex. Loch.

Two Miles Flat Race—1st, Geo. Findlay; 2nd, Alex. Mann; 3rd, A. I. Simpson.

In the Western District Championship we finished fourth. Our placed men were—A. Loch (5); F. McCormack (12); G. Findlay (24); J. McCormack (52); Wm. Lough (61); P. Sharky (98).

In the National Cross-Country Championship of Scotland we supplied the first man home, viz., S. S. Watt. In the Team Honours we were placed 2nd to Edinburgh Harriers, with 82 points to their 54. Our placed men were—Sam. Watt (1); Alex. Mann (4); R. Frew (15); A. I. Simpson (16); J. McGhie (19); Wm. Lough (27).

The Annual Team Contest and Seven Miles Handicap was held at Scotstoun Show Grounds, on 12th November, 1910. The Individual and Team Entries were more numerous than ever. Paisley Junior Harriers took 1st place, Motherwell Y.M.C.A. 2nd place, and Clydesdale Harriers 3rd place. The individual placings were as follows—1st, A. McPhee, Junr., Clydesdale Harriers; 2nd, J. Duffy, Edinburgh Harriers; 3rd, H. Hughes, West of Scotland Harriers.

In the International Cross-Country Championship Team three representatives were selected from our Club, viz., A. McPhee, Jun., A. Mann, and S. S. Watt.

One of our youngest members, Ralph Erskine, has achieved great success in the Boxing World during the past season. Amongst his numerous victories may be mentioned those in the English Public Schools Championship, the Scottish Championship, the World's Amateur Featherweight Championship at New York, and his defeat of the French champion in Paris.

The Annual Sports were held at Ibrox, on 27th May, and were very successful from an athletic standpoint. Boxing and Wrestling Contests were included in the programme, and not only were we able to make ends meet, but we cleared a few pounds as a result.

As the Treasurer's Report shows, the Club is now in a healthier condition financially than it has been for some years, and judging from the large number of recruits who have joined our ranks, the new season promises to be even more successful than any of recent years.

To assure that success each member should make it a duty, as it is sure to be a pleasure to attend every run if possible throughout the season.
