CLYDESDALE HARRIERS

Cross-Country Regulations

1.—That Cross-Country Runs be held on Saturdays, from 1st October to the end of March, or on such dates as the Committee may fix.

2.—That the Club when out for a run shall be under the management of the Captain or Vice-Captain or Senior Member of the Committee present, who shall appoint a pace-maker and whip for the control of each pack.

3. When out for a run each pack shall observe a distance of at least four yards behind the pace-maker, unless the run be a racing run, or the signal be given by the whip for a race home.

4. That every Member of the Club is expected to wear the Club Uniform at the Club Runs, and to support the management for the time being.

Club Races

Entries will close at 2.50 p.m. on Saturday of race unless otherwise posted on notice-board.

Members should always support these races as it is only by success in racing that the Club will regain its former position.

CLYDESDALE HARRIERS

RULES

I.—That the Club shall be called the “CLYDESDALE HARRIERS.”

II.—That the object of the Club be to encourage and further the interest of track and cross-country running, and Amateur Athletics in general.

III.—That the general management of the Club be vested in a Committee of fifteen (male members only) who shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Club, including, at least, a President, Vice-President, Secretary and Assistant Secretary, Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer, and Captain and Vice-Captain. Five Members to form a quorum.

IV.—That each candidate for election sends with his application the Subscription for the first year, which will

be returned if he is not elected; and the candidate must also make the declaration that he is an Amateur, according to the following definition:—
“An Amateur is one who has never competed for a money prize or monetary consideration, or for any declared wager or staked bet; who has never engaged in, assisted in, or taught any athletic exercises as a means of pecuniary gain; and who has never taken part in any competition with any one who is not an Amateur”; and that he will abide by the laws of the Club, shall be proposed by one Member and seconded by another, after which his name will be submitted to the Committee, and, if agreed upon, passed. Any Member of Committee shall have the power of demanding a Ballot in the case of any Candidate. One Black Ball in four to exclude.

V.—That the Annual Subscriptions should be 10/-, and for Junior Members between 16 and 19 years of age, 5/-; for Juvenile Members 13-15 years of age, 2/6; Ladies, 13-15 years of age, 2/6; Senior Lady Members, 5/-.

VI.—That the Treasurer shall place before the Committee the names of all Members one month in arrears for subscriptions or other moneys, the Committee having power to deal with such Members.

VII.—(a) That any Member intending to withdraw from the Club shall give written notice to the Secretary.

(b) Any Member failing to pay his Annual Subscription within two calendar months of that subscription falling due shall automatically be suspended from the Club until all arrears of payment are met.

VIII.—That any Member violating the Rules of the Club or of the Amateur definition, as per Rule IV., or doing anything prejudicial to the interests of either, may be expelled from the Club by the votes of two-thirds of the full Committee.

IX.—That the Uniform of the Club be Black Pants with white band at sides and foot, and White Singlet with black facings and letter "C" in black

on front and back. Ladies—White Blouse with black "C" on back. (Members are specially requested to enter under the name of the Club at Athletic Meetings.)

X.—The Committee shall appoint any Sub-Committees which they may consider advisable, and have full power to fill up vacancies in the General Committee, and to act for the Club, the majority in all cases (except that of Rule VIII.) to decide, the Chairman or President of the Club, however, having the power to appeal to a full Special General Committee Meeting. That the General Committee Meeting be held on the second Wednesday of each month, or as near that date as possible, at least two days' notice to be given by the Secretary or Assistant Secretary, when, together with other current business, the Minutes of the Sub-Committees, as well as the Treasurer's Financial Statement up to the end of the previous month will be read and considered. The Minutes of Committee Meetings shall be open for inspection by the Members on request.

XI.—Any Committee Member absent from two consecutive Regular Meetings, after receiving due intimation of same, shall be excluded from the Committee unless he previously gives notice of his intention of not being present.

XII.—That two General Meetings be held in each year, one in the beginning of April and one in the beginning of September, and called by Circular. At the said meetings the Interim Reports of the Secretary and Treasurer shall be submitted, while at the Meeting in September, in addition thereto, the Office-bearers and Committee (with Auditor to act in conjunction with one appointed by the Committee) shall be appointed for the ensuing year. Fifteen Members shall form a quorum; a majority to decide.

XIII.—That a Special General Meeting may be called by the President, Committee, or by any ten Members, on giving notice to the Secretary or Assistant Secretary, who shall call the Meeting by circular. At least twenty Members must be present at such meeting.

XIV.—That these Rules be inserted in the Club's "Handbook," and that no alteration in, or addition to, the Rules be made except at the General Meeting in September, or at a Special Meeting called for that purpose. Notice of such alteration to be given to the Secretary or Assistant Secretary at least fourteen days previous to any Special General Meeting or to the Annual General Meeting in September. That anything outwith these Rules be governed by the Rules of the S.A.A.A., S.W.A.A.A., and N.C.C.U. of Scotland.

XV.—That the Club shall have power to confer Honorary Membership upon any person as a token of esteem.
