## EDINBURGH NORTHERN WIN TROPHY.

THE seventh annual race for the George Mackenzie Relay Trophy, carried through under the auspices of the National Cross Country Union of Scotland, Eastern division, drew out a large and representative number of clubs to Davidson's Mains, Edinburgh. There were 18 entries this year, but prior to the race that number was reduced to 17, owing to Edinburgh University Hare and Hounds having to withdraw one of their three teams. The race was approximately one of 10 miles, each of the four members of the competing teams covering the course of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles, which was over grass land, plough, and road. Although the conditions for running were not of the best, the times returned for each lap were quite up to standard.

Gala led the field at the end of the first lap, and Edinburgh Southern, Canon, and Edinburgh Northern all followed close on the heels of the Border representative. When the runners came into view at the end of the second lap, it was seen that the Southern had taken the lead, with the Northern second. The Gala representative had fallen into third place, and Northern second string runner was fourth. The position was again reversed over the third lap, the Northern taking the lead for the first time in the race. Northern, Southern, Gala, and Northern A was the order at the end of the third lap, and that order was preserved to the end, the Northern throwing off the challenge of the Southern runner, and winning by 15 seconds. The winner's time was 54 mins. 10 secs., and the runner's-up 54 mins. 25 secs. It was W. Morris, the third string runner of the Northern, who made the win possible, as he turned a seven seconds' deficit into a 42 seconds' lead, thus giving his colleague a start of nearly 75 yards in the last lap.
