## Shettleston's relay domination ends

For the first time in six years the name of Shettleston Harriers will not go down as winners of the Midland District relay championship. Even less likely will it be recorded anywhere that they lost without flickering an iota of interest in any of the few dozen bystanders at Lochinch playing fields, Dumbreck.

The domination, the ease belonged for a change to Victoria Park, who, in Shettleston fashion, took the lead on the first of the four legs and never relinquished it. Three of the four who appeared for Shettleston would not blanch at the description "stand-in," for they were no more than that. Absent were Blamire, Stewart, Wedlock, and Bannion, and no team can afford this loss.

This, according to a leading official of the club, was not considered one of their priority meetings — the absentees were being "rested" for next week's club and International race at Parliament Hill, London, being televised by BBC. Only Norman Morrison of their London team pulled on a pair of running shoes, and his effort was far from full-

blooded, lifting them from thirteenth to eighth on the third leg. Their last man, Daniel O'Kane, slipped once more to thirteenth.

Victoria Park were extremely well served by David McMeekin and Pat MacLagan. McMeekin led in the 45 starters on the first leg in 12min. 26sec., third best of the day as it turned out. Hugh Barrow, one of the most familiar figures in an athletics vest these last few years, conserved first place, and then MacLagan sealed the victory by carving out an unbeatable lead for his last man, Colin Youngson. MacLagan, timed at 12min. 26sec., was second fastest of the race.

The honour of being fastest fell once again to the amazing workhorse of Monkland Harriers, 20-year-old Jim Brown. He thrives on adversity. Running the last leg, he strode off in tenth place and covered the two-and-a-half miles of true cross-country terrain in 12min. 7sec., overtaking four runners on the way. Indeed, he only just failed to catch one of Springburn's veterans, Eddie Sinclair, by two seconds on the run-in. Clyde's Harriers had

every reason to be delighted at taking second place, and all the more creditable in the absence of Allan Faulds, usually their leading man. Ian Donald ran nobly as Faulds's replacement on the second leg, surrendering only two places in dropping to sixth. Philip Dolan lifted them to third and then Douglas Gemmell made Clydesdale's day by passing Alec Brown (Law and District) on the final leg at the same time turning in the sixth best time of the championship.

### FINE POLICING

The trail markings and stewarding were exemplary — they could hardly be otherwise, manned by Glasgow Police cadets. The Lochinch ground is the police sports ground and if anyone was disappointed with the work done by those sports-conscious policemen, Harry Stephens and George Boyes, he must be hard to please.
