## J. F. WOOD EASTERN CHAMPION.

J. F. Wood, Heriot's Cross-Country Club, justified favouritism by winning comfortably the 25th Eastern District 7 miles championship at Musselburgh. H. M'Intosh, Edinburgh Northern, was second about 300 yards behind. Wood led the field of 150 competitors from the  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles mark.

Edinburgh Harriers had an equally easy team victory. Their counting six aggregated only 71 points. Dundee Thistle dumbfounded the prophets by finishing second.

Better team performances were expected by the other Capital clubs. Canon, however, had to start without the services of A. C. Ruthven and C. Harkins.

# Eastern District Cross-Country Championship at Hawick.



The start-off in Victoria Road of the 160 runners in the Eastern District Cross-Country Championship at Hawick on Saturday.

The Eastern District cross-country championship took place at Hawick on Saturday, when thirteen teams of twelve runners each and one individual turned out. The route was about  $\frac{7}{8}$  miles, starting from the Haugh and going round by the back of Wilton Lodge to Wilton Dean, Howlets Plantation, Overhall, Borthwick, Martins House, Langbeagh, and the New Road to the starting point, and thence over the same route again. Provost Nichol acted as starter. Dundee Thistle were the winners, and J. M. Petrie of the same team was the first man home. Gala Harriers were placed second, and the Hawick Teviotdale team finished sixth.

## EASTERN DISTRICT CROSS-COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIP.

The annual Eastern District Cross-Country Championship race for the Fraser Trophy took place at Hawick on Saturday. Thirteen teams competed from Edinburgh, Fife, Dundee, and the Borders, and there was also one individual entry. The teams consisted of twelve runners each, and they assembled in the Common Haugh, and were dispatched on the race by Provost Nichol. The route extended to about seven miles or so, round by the back of Wilton Lodge to Wilton Dean, Howlets Plantation, Overhall, Borthwaugh, Martinshouse, Langheugh, and the New Road to the starting point, and thence over the same route again.
