### Shettleston's Double Win in Junior Event

It was not expected that Harry Howard (Shettleston Harriers) would meet any serious challenge in the seven miles' junior team and individual open-country open race at Fallisshaw on Saturday. At half distance in the double-lap course he held a substantial lead, running well within himself.

In the end he won easily by fully 300 yards in 39min. 23sec.—good time over a heavy and sticky stretch of pasture land.

His clubmate, E. McAllister, did well to finish second in a field of 110 runners. C. McPherson (Maryhill Harriers) fell into third place, 40 yards behind McAllister.

The team race was won by Shettleston Harriers with six runners in the first 17, their score being 53 points. Maryhill Harriers were second and Garscube third. Results:—
