LOCAL RUNNERS' TRIUMPH

Team Honour for Glenpark

WELLPARK FINISH SECOND

Greenock clubs monopolised the team honours in the South Western District 7 miles championship.

The race was over a stiff trail at Johnstone, and in being placed first and second the local clubs did exceedingly well. When Glenpark won this event in 1934 the runners-up on that occasion were Wellpark. Perhaps next year will see the positions reversed. Wellpark have had bad luck in this event, for on Saturday they completed the hat-trick for the runners-up position.

RAN WITH FINE JUDGMENT

Auchmountain had three representatives in the race, and these lads put in some fine work, to finish 22, 23, and 45. The foundation of the Glenparkers' victory was laid by their young leader, J. Thomson, who eclipsed his previous performances by chasing the winner right home to the tape. Thomson ran with grand judgment, and some of the critics who watched the race predicted a brilliant future for the Gourock boy. At the start of the race Jacky was nowhere, and it was thought that he had struck a bad patch, but he had other ideas, and it was not until two miles had been covered that he began to forge ahead.

At three miles he was running third, and so hot was the pace that he did not attempt to hold his position, but allowed others to pass him. When the second circuit was entered into, he gradually moved up again, and at six miles he was in the position which he finally held. That of runner-up. For a novice, this youth is nothing short of wonderful, and his performance on Saturday recalls the compliment made to him by Mr D. M'Swein of Wellpark, when Thomson won the McGregor Cup. On that occasion Mr M'Swein said that in his opinion this youth is the best novice that this district has produced for many years.

A curious feature of the race was the fact that C. Berry of Glenpark, who was fifth man for the victors, jumps from novice status to the senior class without having been a junior.

In finishing second team, Wellpark Harriers showed improvement on their recent form, and should have no difficulty in landing the full honours next year. The team included three novices, and with proper care these lads should develop into excellent cross-country men.
