

HARRIERS.

WESTERN DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP.—The Junior Championship of the Western District of the National Cross-Country Union of Scotland was decided on Saturday. The scene of the gathering was Carnoustie Racecourse, Parkhead, Glasgow. Twenty-five teams of 12 (6 to count) were entered, against 26 last year. The luck of the ballot gave the precedence all starting to Clydesdale. Last year the team championship was won by Monkland Harriers, R. Bell of that club being the individual winner. The crowd of over 500 runners were sent off at a fast pace, J. M. Fyde, Paisley Juniors, and W. P. Brown, Glasgow V.M.C.A. Harriers, leading the way. Leaving the grounds after the second round, the pack were headed by J. Lindsay, G. Cummings, and W. H. Maible, Bellahouston Harriers; A. B. Lang, Greenock Glenpark, and Andrew Sempie, Shettleston. In half an hour the leading runners were seen coming over the hill, the first to appear on the track being J. Lindsay, Bellahouston, who had a lead of 300 yards from Andrew Sempie, Shettleston, with D. Cummings, Paisley Harriers, in third place. The team championship was won by Bellahouston Harriers with an aggregate of 57 points, their six placed men being J. Lindsay 1, W. H. Maible 3, G. Cummings 7, J. Barker 12, H. Malcolm 15, and T. G. Skene 17—57. Greenock Glenpark secured second place with 143; Maryhill third with 158; and Garscube North with 159.
