

The Scottish internationalist, Moyra O'Boyle (Victoria Park AC) easily won the West women's cross-country championship at Bellahouston Park, Glasgow yesterday. She led from the start and won in the time of 29min 35sec, over 500 yards ahead of Christine McMeekin (Maryhill Ladies AC) with Alison Brown (Greenock Rankin Park) third. Maryhill won the team race with 24 points from Greenock Rankin Park (38).

Rankin Park dominated the intermediate three miles race with Janet Duncan winning the individual title in 20min 20sec, closely followed by her team-mate, Lesley Langan with Christine Hutton (Law & District AC) third. Rankin Park won the team race. Other winners — Junior girls — 1. F. McQueen (VP), 9min 50sec; 2. M. Pahnke (Clyde Valley), 10min 5sec. Teams — 1. Bellahouston 32 points; 2. Victoria Park 42.
