

1	NORMA CAMPBELL	Berwick-upon-Tweed	over 45
	Mother of three sons, the oldest of whom is 20, Norma first started running competitively at the age of 40. She has represented North East England in cross-country matches. Swimming is another favourite hobby. She is looking forward to competing in running events for many years yet. - so much for this new found enjoyment at 40 !		
2	RITA DOCHERTY	Greenock	over 35
	Mother of two young girls, Rita has been a supporter of women's cross-country for the past 14 years and has competed in many championship events. She recently completed a solo sponsored run (for church funds) of 15 miles from Largs to Greenock and did it in just over two hours. Her husband is also an enthusiastic runner but although in the men's event to-day, he will be more interested and proud of Rita !		
3	ELEANOR GUNSTONE	St. Andrews	over 45
	Has never competed prior to this event ! Inherited interest from the four younger members of the family who all run. Secretary of her local athletics club. The family name is currently 'big' in Scottish running circles. To turn out in to-day's event Mrs. Gunstone, never having run a race before, deserves her name to 'star' as big as any of the family !

4	DALE S. GREIG	Paisley	over 35
	Has been on the run for 20 years ! Four times winner of the Scottish Women's cross-country title. Founder member of the SWCCU. First President of the Women's International C-C Union.. U.K. best performance at the marathon (3hrs 27min 25 secs) which was then a world record set at Isle of Wight 1964. Ran the Isle of Man famous TT course (40 miles) a fortnight after running a marathon in 1971 and in 1972 was the first woman ever to complete the ultra long distance classic London to Brighton-on the same day that Alastair Wood broke the record. Winner of the first Women's World Veteran Marathon Championship in Paris 1974.		
5	AILEEN LUSK	Bishopbriggs	over 45
	Mother of two, Aileen has been running since she was 24 and deserves acknowledgement as one of our pioneer veterans. She has maintained her interest and enthusiasm throughout the years; continuing on in true veteran spirit of enjoying the sport without the spur of honours to be won. She was three times winner of the Scottish cross-country title in the mid 1950's and a member of winning National teams. She is also a former title/record holder at 880 yards and 1 mile.		
6	NOREEN O'BOYLE	Clydebank	over 45
	With a husband Cyril (a competitor to-day) and daughter Moira (now a top track and C-C runner) out training every evening, Noreen, with no previous background, was eventually induced to start herself when she was 40. That takes a big heart ! Her verdict - "I wish I had started years ago !" In the last few years Noreen has progressed remarkably and looks forward to being well placed in to-day's event. She merits success !		
7	NESSIE STEEL	Linwood	over 35
	Started running at 18 and by the age of 20 was a c-c internationalist. Now with a family of five Nessie returned to the sport about three years ago through the interest of her sons. She sings in a local choir; travels to Paisley several times a week to coach girls at the club. Looks forward to to-day's event.		
8	MOLLY WILMOTH	Kirkintilloch	over 35
	Has been in the sport for some 20 years. Mother of two children, 12 and 9 years old, Molly is a former cross-country internationalist and twice winner of the Scottish 880 yards title. Coaches local girls at Kirkintilloch. She thinks the concepts of our Vet Association a wonderful idea.
