## N.C.C.U. NOVICE CHAMPIONSHIPS.

The twelfth annual novice team and individual championships promoted by the National Cross-Country Union of Scotland were decided on Saturday at Hamilton Park Racecourse. Out of a record entry of 40 teams and 6 individuals all were present except Airthmountain Harriers and Edinburgh University Hares and Hounds. The latter club had seven runners forward, but as only two of these—J. G. Robertson and J. T. Stodart—were included in the team as entered, they could only compete as individuals, and finished 125th and 84th respectively. It was only when the teams lined up that the discrepancy in the University ranks was discovered, and the field of over 300 competitors was well down the straight when the two eligible members of the team got away. The course was one of slanting five miles, and, although nearly all on grass, the going was very heavy as a result of the recent rains. Each team comprised eight runners, of whom the first four to finish counted in the team placings. All the competitors in the race were concerned in the individual event. At half-distance R. Simpson, Motherwell Y.M.C.A. Harriers, had a slight lead over A. D. Macdonald and J. Thomson, both of Garscubie Harriers, while Springburn Harriers seemed to be well in the running for the team event. There were few changes in the individual order on the latter part of the journey, for Simpson ran out winner of a splendid contest by a matter of 30 yards from Macdonald. Springburn failed to sustain their forward placings, while Garscubie had consolidated theirs to run out comfortable winners by a margin of 35 points. Of the 12 championships, Shettleston Harriers have won five, and Garscubie Harriers four. Over 300 started, and 285 completed the full course. Results:—

## NOVICE HONOURS FOR GARSCUBE AND MOTHERWELL.

**G**ARSCUBE HARRIERS, one of the most successful clubs in the history of the Scottish Novice Cross-Country Championship, gained another victory, their fourth, at Hamilton on Saturday. They aggregated 40 points, beating Plebeian Harriers by a margin of 35 points. Springburn were third, with only four points more than Plebeian.

R. Simpson, Motherwell Y.M.C.A., ran out a brilliant winner of the individual championship. A. D. McDonald, Garscube, was second, and J. M'Lean, Plebeian, third. The time of 28 minutes 58 seconds was distinctly good considering the heavy conditions of the five-miles course.

### SIMPSON'S FINE EFFORT.

On the completion of the first lap (approximately 2½ miles, time 15 mins. 53 secs.) James Thomson (Garscube), R. Simpson (Motherwell), D. Spiers (Shawfield), A. D. McDonald (Garscube), T. M'Laren (Garscube), Neil Graham (Paisley), M. Nicholson (Plebeian), G. B. Tait (West of Scotland), J. M'Lean (Plebeian), and a group of Springburn members headed the field. At this stage it was obvious that Garscube were in a winning position.

Entering the stretch of open country, shortly after leaving the racecourse, R. Simpson (Motherwell Y.M.C.A.) took up the running, and from that point he was never seriously challenged. Continuing to race confidently and well, the Motherwell youth faced the home straight of the racecourse in gallant fashion, and although A. D. McDonald (Garscube) tried hard to keep on terms, it was of no avail against the strong-going Motherwell lad, who raced home looking round.

### PRESENTATION HUMOUR.

Mr. Tom Jack, M.A., President of the N.C.C.U., was in excellent form at the presentation of awards. Referring to the success of Garscube Harriers, whose President is Mr. Condie Chalmers, Mr. Jack said that the secret of their success must surely be the application of "Condy's Fluid."

The vice-chairman, Mr. Tom M'Allister, commented most flatteringly on the knowledge possessed by the chairman, and said that Tom Jack was well fitted to deliver a profitable lecture on the easiest way to race across country.

Mr. Jack succinctly replied in two words—"Don't race."

# Y.M.C.A. HARRIERS.

On Saturday last the National Novice Championship was decided at Hamilton Race course, where another niche was carved in the history of Motherwell Y.M.C.A. Harriers by the winning of the National Novice Championship of Scotland through the medium of Robert Simpson. This honour, so far, had always eluded Motherwell until this year, although two years ago Robert Graham almost brought the honour home, when he ran a wonderful race to be just beaten for first place. By the winning of the individual title, R. Simpson has now definitely placed himself in the forefront of cross-country running, and more will be heard about him when the other races come along. That cross country running is gaining a hold everywhere, there is no doubt, as the large entry of forty teams will testify. The spectators were about the same as usual, but the rain probably kept many away. The trail for the race started from the Bothwell side of the race-course and then round the big loop twice, after that along the straight past the grandstand and into the country, entering the race-course again at the Hamilton end, finishing at the grand stand. Over three hundred runners faced the starter, and when the pistol went the runners moved en masse, looking in the distance more like a herd of cattle stampeding. After the loop had been completed once, it was evident from a Motherwell point of view that Bobby was going to give the best of them a run for it, as he was well up and running well within himself. At the completion of the second lap round the loop, that opinion was strengthened and prior to entering the country, he was running second. The leaders at this stage were Thomson, Garscube; Simpson, Motherwell; Spiers, Shawfield; and M'Donald of Garscube, so thus it was evident that Garscube with a little care had the winning of the Team Championship, while Simpson stood, or rather ran between them and the double. Meanwhile, Motherwell's other men, while running well, were just too far back to be of any support to Simpson for the Team Championship. Roddy Devon, Stewart Adams, Jimmy Stevenson and Jimmy Taylor, were all running within one or two places from each other, while Matt Love was just behind and gaining places. When the stretch known by the runners as Hill 60 was reached, it was seen that Simpson was leading by two yards from M'Donald, but so strong was Simpson running that he passed the judges fully 25 yards ahead of M'Donald in the remarkably good time of 28 mins. 58 secs., thus in no uncertain fashion did Bobby proclaim himself Novice Champion of Scotland. Garscube won the Team Championship, while Plebian and Springburn were second and third respectively. Motherwell's actual team place was nineteenth. The placings were R. Simpson, 1, R. Devon 105, S. Adams 115, J. Stevenson 128. The unplaced finished in the following order, M. Love, J. Taylor, D. Ferguson, and J. M'Clurg. It is pleasing to note the improvement of S. Adams and J. Stevenson, who improved their places as compared to the club Novice. To-morrow, the annual run and social evening will be held from Strathaven. Meet, Motherwell Cross, 1.45 p.m.
