

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP OF SCOT- LAND.

This race, run under the Cross-Country Union of Scotland, took place on Saturday under very auspicious conditions of weather, attendance, number of teams represented, and the pace and style of the men engaged. The trail, one of somewhat less than five miles in a circuit outside and across country, in the direction of Jordanhill, Great Western Road, Anniesland, up through that country and back to the grounds of the Glasgow Agricultural Society, once round and out to the open again, returning once more, and finishing on the front of the south range of the stabling. The prizes were for the first lot of arrivals of six men in each team, with prizes to the first arrivals. Nine teams had entered, and these included twelve men each from last year's winning team, and from Edinburgh (three clubs), Glasgow (three clubs), and eight well-known cross-country men, who contended for the individual honours, and hailing out of clubs in Edinburgh, Dundee, Glasgow, and Alashiel. The referee was Mr A. M. Bryson; judges—Messrs McCulloch, Balchin, Hannah, Bartermen, and Curment, with Messrs Hume, Jackson, and Brownriggs timekeepers. Upwards of 43, irrespective of the reserves, ran for the junior champion's medal. The first to be sighted on arriving at the hill outside the field showed much signs of the work through which they had passed, and there was great tailing off although several ran in clumps. Templeman, Bellahouston; 11th, Jas. Torrie, Gala Harriers; 12th, J. S. Matthew, Dundee Thistle; 16th, Peter J. Melville, Watsonians; 33rd, H. T. Jamieson, P. C. Russell, Bellahouston, and A. P. Baker, both as individual competitors, did not start. The juniors' championship winner's place and time was 9th in the race, 59min. 47sec.

After the race all made tracks to and had supper in the Restaurant Rooms of the Glasgow Y.M.C.A. Institute, 100 Bothwell Street, Glasgow, where after the inner man had been provided for, the medals, &c., were presented to the teams and individuals, and a good time enjoyed.
