## **SHETTLESTON HARRIERS REPEAT FEBRUARY TRIUMPH**

Shettleston Harriers, who won the Western District Cross-Country Championship a month ago, scored another meritorious victory on Saturday by winning the National Championship by a substantial margin.

There were ten teams (twelve men, six to count) in the running, the clubs represented being Bellahouston (winners in 1913 and 1914), Edinburgh Northern, Edinburgh Southern, Clydesdale, Garscube, Greenock, Glenpark, Maryhill, Motherwell Y.M.C.A., Shettleston, and Edinburgh Harriers. West of Scotland Harriers had a team entered, but were unable to muster more than five men. Eight entered for individual honours.

Jas. Wilson (Greenock Glenpark Harriers) took the lead in the first half-mile, which was covered before leaving Rouken Glen Park, and by half-distance of the ten miles course had drawn away to the extent of a quarter of a mile from A. Craig (Bellahouston Harriers). He kept his advantage to the finish, thus winning the individual championship. Craig was second, and Duncan Wright (Clydesdale Harriers) third.

Harriers (Angus Kerr 9, James Humphries 13, John Williamson 15, John Humphries 17, E. Lawson 23, and D. Burt 48—125 points); 3, Bellahouston Harriers, 126 points; 4, Greenock Glenpark Harriers, 145 points; Edinburgh Northern Harriers, 191 points; Edinburgh Southern Harriers, 283 points.
