

J. H. MOTION WINS THE CHAMPIONSHIP SHETTLESTON RETAIN THE TEAM HONOURS

In the absence of James Wilson, last year's winner of the cross country championship of Scotland, Satan's result looked very open. Many fancied that G. Wallach would repeat his 1914 victory, and at a distance he looked like doing so, as he had a lead of fully 60 yards from J. H. Motion. The English Harrier, however, proved the better stayer over the heavy course, and finished some eighty yards ahead of Wallach. A. B. Laurie, Garscube Harriers, was third.
