Shettleston Harriers' Success in National Championship

D. M'L. WRIGHT'S FEAT

Under ideal underfoot conditions, but with a bitter wind blowing, the Scottish National Cross-Country Team and Individual Championships were decided at Musselburgh on Saturday.

The track was for the most part on the springy turf of Musselburgh Racecourse, with three short excursions over farm land alternating.

Over 200 runners went out. Western runners took all the honours, and should figure well in the Scottish international team of nine to be chosen this week at Glasgow.

The holder of the Individual Championship, D. M'L. Wright, who ran for Clydesdale Harriers last year, repeated his win, this time for Shettleston Harriers.

He never was headed, and at half distance led by thirty yards, which he had increased to fifty before the end.

Shettleston Harriers, who won the Team Championship in 1920, 1921, and 1922, won again. Results:—
