

Scottish Women's Championships**COMPLETELY NEW SET OF CHAMPIONS**

ALL the holders lost their titles in the Scottish Women's Cross-Country Championships, held on firm, undulating grassland surrounding the Heriot-Watt University Playing Fields, Edinburgh, last Saturday. First to fall, in bright winter sunshine, with snow covering the nearby Pentland Hills, was Kerry Williams, but inevitably her conquerors were from her own amazing Pitreavie club; in fact, Pitreavie girls occupied the first five places in the Girls race. In the Junior race, Anne Cherry was bidding for her third title in a row, but could not shake off Penny Gunstone, who finally broke the 'Fauldhouse Flyer' in the run-in to win by four seconds. Anne revealed afterwards that she had only resumed training five days before the championship after ten days lay-off with 'flu. Mary Stewart did not appear to defend her Intermediate title, thus robbing the meeting of its expected highlight—the clash of Mary and bang-on-form Moira O'Boyle. In the absence of her most formidable rival, Moira beat another Anglo Scot, Shiela Barrass, by over a minute.

In the senior race, Christine Haskett—now training in social science in England and entered from Stretford AC—broke away from holder Margaret Coomber and Ann Barrass in the last quarter of the race to win impressively by nearly half-a-minute. With Mary Chambers fourth, Palm Gunstone—top of the domestic scene all season—was the first home Scot in fifth position. Dale Greig, with eyes on the Boston Marathon in

April, was happy with her finishing position in the first dozen.

A feature of the championships was the family participation. Penny Gunstone, shock Junior champion, is sister-in-law to Palm Gunstone; Moira O'Boyle is daughter of Noreen, an astounding thirteenth in the senior event, and there were three Barrass girls from Aldershot—Sheila, second in the Intermediate; Ann, third in the Senior; and Jean, seventh in the Junior.

She came away strongly in the second leg to beat the holder, Margaret Coomber, by almost 100 yards.
