

The women's championship at Rosyth yesterday saw Lynne MacDougall carve out yet another victory over Yvonne Murray (Edinburgh AC). Lynne (McLaren Glasgow AC), stalked her capital rival, hoping to outsprint her towards the end.

The Edinburgh girl, aware of the danger, tried to get away, opening a 30-yard gap, but the Olympic 1500 metres finalist remorselessly cut her down, and went away to win by 22 seconds in 24.59.

Third was Dundee's Chris Haskett-Price, making a comeback after the birth of a son — which means almost certainly a brother and sister in the world championship team. The women will choose their squad tomorrow.

Miss MacDougall, running on the country for only the second time in four months, does not wish to be selected for that team. She wishes to concentrate on track
