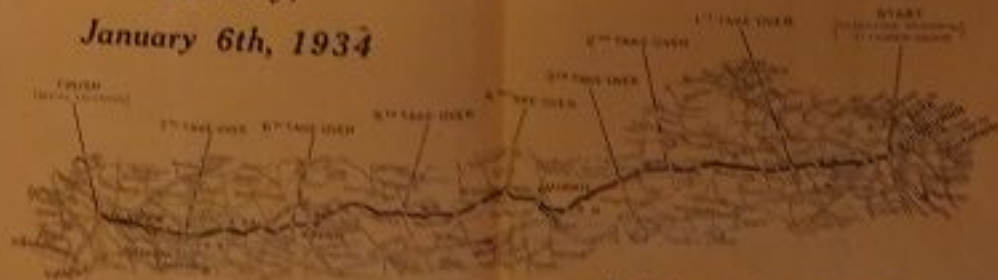

RELAYS AND TAKE-OVER STATIONS

The runners, totalling 144 will be divided into eight relays of 18. Each competitor must wear, back and front, his own letter number as shown in this programme.

FIRST RELAY.—Starting by Gladstone Memorial, St. Andrews Square, North David Street, Queen Street, Albany Place, St. Colme Street, Annlie Place, Great Stuart Street, Randolph Crescent, Melville Street, Manor Place, Coates Place, West Mainland Street, Haymarket Station, Clifton Terrace, Haymarket Terrace, under Railway Arch, Roseburn Terrace, Corporation Road, Maybury Cross. First take over. Distance $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

SECOND RELAY.—Main Glasgow Road, Left Fork to Newbridge, over Stone Bridge, under Viaduct, Right Fork main, by Bonburn A.A. Inn to Bonburn East U. F. Church. 6 miles.

THIRD RELAY.—Main Road, to Tybalt, Right Fork main, Sharp Rise, Deacons' Brae, back going to Wester Doonhill Farm. 4 miles.

FOURTH RELAY.—Main Road right fork, then fork left for Bathgate, over level crossing Annadale (Cloth Clock Tower). $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

FIFTH RELAY.—Main Road, Blackridge, over Railway Bridge, Forresterfield Station, Forresterfield Inn. $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

SIXTH RELAY.—Main Road, Hillend, Caldercraigs, under Railway Bridge, A.A. Signs, Plains Clarkston, Airdrie, Alexandra Street, Airdrie War Memorial. 7 miles.

SEVENTH RELAY.—Main Road, under Railway Bridge, Coathridge Greyhound Enclosure, under Two Bridges, Bank Street, Coathridge, Hargreaves P.O., Baillieston, Spring Hill Cross, Barzachair. Telephone Box. $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

EIGHTH RELAY.—Main Shettleston Road, Shettleston, right fork, under Railway bridge, Duke Street, High Street, Ingram Street, Royal Exchange (Queen Street). 5 miles.

Full distance: 44½ Miles.

ARRANGEMENTS

Competitors will be able to follow the course throughout quite easily. At every milestone or doubtful corner, a large "News of the World" arrow signpost, or similar device, will be seen indicating the correct road. An official car will also be with the leaders.

All competitors at the various Tolbooth stations, must wait for the "touch" from the operating committee before racing off. Only two starts can be run for their club.

Every competitor is **urgently requested to wear his own "letter, number" back and front**, corresponding with that shown in this programme. This is essential and is of great help to the officials.

Each relay team will be conveyed to its respective relay station by motor coach, and each coach will show the number corresponding to the relay that it is engaged for.

Mr. W. J. Pepper (A.A.A.) will be in sole control of the transport. All competitors and coach stewards must report to him at the Y.M.C.A., South St. Andrew St., Edinburgh, ready to leave with their clubs, in the coaches' shop at 10.30 a.m. Nobody will be waited for.

The Br. Hon. Lord Provost of Edinburgh will dispatch a letter to Mr. Prov. Lord Provost of Glasgow. This letter will be carried throughout by the leading runner. Whenever the letter carrier is passed by another competitor, the letter must be handed on to the new leader.

Competitors will meet at Edinburgh Y.M.C.A., South St. Andrew St.

St. Andrew's Archduke's Bridge will be in attendance along the course.

Competitors and officials with tickets are requested to attend the Cadogan Restaurant, Union Street, Glasgow, immediately after the race for tea, when the Trophy and Medals will be presented to the winners.

AWARDS

"Hector of the Belford" Challenge Trophy

Four sets of specially designed medals for the first four teams to finish.

Gold dressed for the winners; Silver for the runners up, and Bronze for the third and fourth.

An extra set of Bronze medals will be awarded to the unplaced team which, in the opinion of the Judges, gave the most improved performance, all past form, track, road or country being considered.
