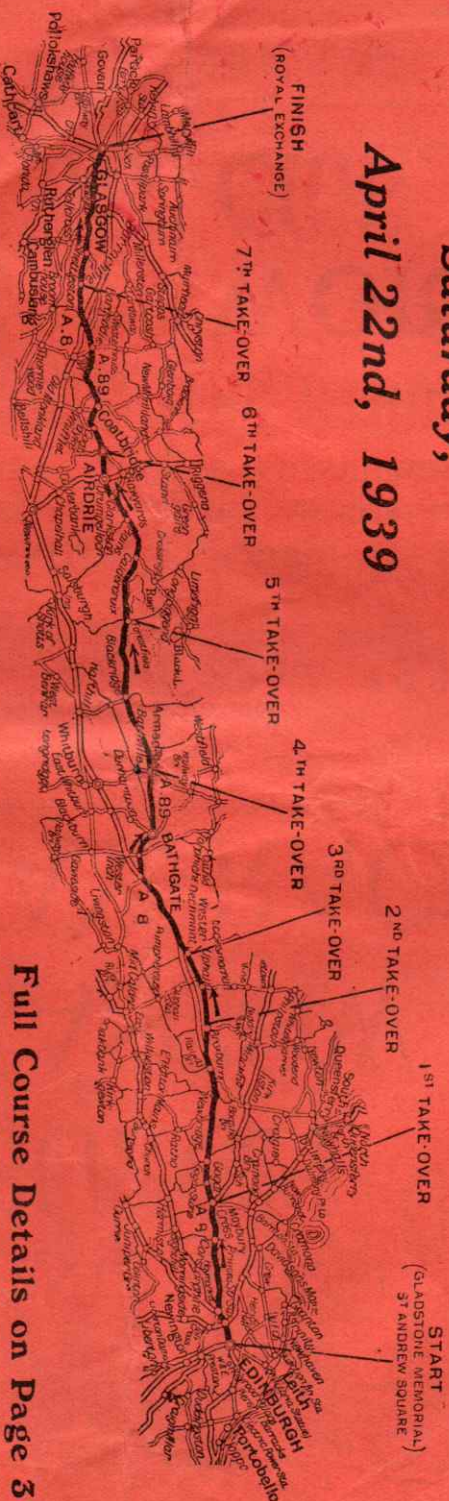

RELAYS AND TAKE-OVER STATIONS

The runners, totalling 136 will be divided into eight relays of 17. Each competitor must wear, back and front, his own letter number as shown in this programme.

FIRST RELAY.—Starting by Gladstone Memorial, St. Andrews Square, North David Street, Queen Street, Albyn Place, St. Colne Street, Ainslie Place, Great Stuart Street, Randolph Crescent, Melville Street, Manor Place, Coates Place, West Maitland Street, Haymarket Station, Clifton Terrace, Haymarket Terrace, under Railway Arch, Roseburn Terrace, Corstorphine Road, Maybury Cross. First take over. Distance $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles. Approximate time of arrival — **11.20 a.m.**

SECOND RELAY.—Main Glasgow Road, Left Fork to Newbridge, over Stone Bridge, under Viaduct, Right Fork main, by Broxburn A.A. box to Broxburn East U. F. Church. 6 miles. **11.55 a.m.**

THIRD RELAY.—Main Road to Uphall, Right Fork main, Sharp Rise to Dechmont (switchback going) to Wester Dechmont Farm. 4 miles. **12.20 p.m.**

FOURTH RELAY.—Main Road right fork, then fork left for Bathgate, over level crossing Armadale (Goth Clock Tower). $5\frac{3}{4}$ miles. **12.50 p.m.**

FIFTH RELAY.—Main Road, Blackridge, over Railway Bridge, Forrestfield Station, Forrestfield Inn. $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles. **1.15 p.m.**

SIXTH RELAY.—Main Road, Hillend, Caldercruix, under Railway Bridge, A.A. Sign, Plains Clarkstone, Airdrie, Alexandra Street, Airdrie War Memorial. 7 miles. **1.50 p.m.**

SEVENTH RELAY.—Main Road, under Railway Bridge, Coatbridge Greyhound Enclosure under Two Bridges, Bank Street, Coatbridge, Bargeddie P.O., Baillieston, Spring Hill Cross, Barrachnie. Telephone Box. $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles. **2.25 p.m.**

EIGHTH RELAY.—Main Shettleston Road, Shettleston, right fork, under Railway bridge, Duke Street, turn left into High Street, turn right into Ingram Street, Royal Exchange (Queen Street). 5 miles. **2.45 p.m.**

Full distance : $44\frac{1}{4}$ Miles.

ARRANGEMENTS

Competitors will be able to follow the course throughout quite easily. At every awkward or doubtful corner, a large "News of the World" arrow signpost, or smaller arrows and banners, will be seen indicating the correct road. An official car will also be with the leaders

All competitors at the various Take-over stations must wait for the "touch" from the oncoming competitor before racing off. Only first claim men can run for their club.

Every competitor must wear his own "letter-number" back and front, corresponding with that shown in this programme.

Each relay team will be conveyed to its respective relay station by motor coach, and each coach will show the number corresponding to the relay that it is engaged for.

Mr. J. O. Hepburn (Bellahouston H.) and G. S. Barber (Maryhill H.) will be in control of the transport. All competitors and coach stewards must report to them at the Y.M.C.A., South St Andrew St., Edinburgh, ready to leave (with their clothes), in the coaches sharp at 10.30 a.m. Nobody will be waited for.

The Rt. Hon. Lord Provost of Edinburgh has written a letter to the Rt. Hon. Lord Provost of Glasgow, and this letter will be enclosed in a ribbon-covered baton and carried throughout by the leading runner. Whenever the letter carrier is passed by another competitor, the letter must be handed on to the new leader. The Rt. Hon. Lord Provost of Glasgow will receive the letter at the winning Post.

Competitors will dress at Edinburgh Y.M.C.A. South St Andrew Street.

St. Andrews Ambulance Brigade will be in attendance along the course.

Competitors and officials with tickets are requested to attend the Cadoro Restaurant Union Street, Glasgow, immediately after the race, for high tea, where the Trophy and Medals will be presented to the winners by the Lord Provost of Glasgow.

AWARDS

Winning Team to hold "News of the World" Trophy

The first four teams to finish will receive a set of specially designed medals (gold-fronted for the winners, silver for the runners-up and bronze for the third and fourth).

An extra set of bronze medals will be awarded to the unplaced team who gave the most improved performance, all form and circumstances considered.

This question will be decided by the following well-known officials, all being disinterested in the qualifying Clubs: G. Dallas, G. M. Grant, W. S. McCarthy, J. McCulloch, D. McSwein, Joe Binks and the Referee.
