Hawk swoops again

DUNDEE Hawkhill Harriers braved freak conditions, from raging blizzards to bright sunshine, to win the national six-stage road relay title, their fourth major crown of the Scottish Cross-Country Union's centenary season.

Already "The Hawk" had swooped to lift the East district cross-country championship and relay honours, plus the Barr's Edinburgh-Glasgow relay title. On Saturday's eve of summer, in weather pulled from the bowels of winter, they also defied conditions which threatened to destroy the Bank of Scotland event.

Over the alternate stages of 3.2 and 6 miles round Livingston, it was a wonder that only competitors' race numbers dropped off. Fingers, too, and even limbs would have been no surprise.

On the final leg, Charlie Haskett was able to consolidate the 12-second lead built by his five Dundee team-mates, and comfortably contained the threats of Cambuslang and Edin-

burgh Southern Harriers. Dundee won in 2hr 17min. 40sec., by 47 seconds from Cambuslang, with Southern third in 2-19-22.

Hawkhill were a distant thirteenth after the opening stage, during which a blizzard raged to such confusing effect that more than 20 leading runners lost the way, retrieving it only after a bizarre debate with a marshal. Happily, the time lost does not seem to have materially affected the result, although Southern's international steeplechaser, George Mathieson, could argue that his 26-second lead would have been even greater.

Steve Ovett, on the next stage, the first long leg, produced an outstanding run, carrying Annan from sixteenth place up into the lead with the fastest time of the day, 29-02, while Cambuslang moved on from seventh to second, with Southern slipping back to twelfth.

Hawkhill, through Dr Peter Fox, climbed from third to second, cutting the gap behind the leaders from 37 seconds to just

nine, behind national cross-country relay champions, Teviotdale.

Ian Campbell, in his first race for three months, took his team into the lead which Haskett was more than capable of holding.

Allister Hutton, cursed with the blizzard at its height, unlike Ovett, was second-fastest over six miles, taking Southern up from eighth to third place. Results:

Ovett defies elements

STEVE OVETT took the atrocious conditions in his stride to record the fastest time in the six-mile leg of the Scottish six-stage road relay championship at Livingston on Saturday.

The 1980 Olympic metres champion, who moved to Scotland from Brighton 18 months ago, took Annan & District from 16th to first place on the second stage, with a time of 29min 02sec, 28sec faster than the next fastest on the day, Allister Hutton of Edinburgh Southern Harriers.

Annan could not maintain the advantage Ovett gave them and eventually finished fourth, 26sec behind Southern, the holders.

Hutton, continuing his

build-up for next month's London Marathon, had taken over in eighth place on the anchor stage, but had no hope of catching Charles Haskett, who took Dundee Hawkhill Harriers home to their first success since this event was started in 1979.

Haskett was third-fastest on the long stage and only seven seconds slower than Hutton. "The first two miles were terrible, the worst I can remember," said Haskett.

Ian Campbell, who put Dundee into the lead on the fifth stage after Peter Fox had pulled them up to second at the end of stage four, was equal fastest for the three-mile stage with 15.37.

The rest of the Dundee team were Brian Cook, Chris

Hall, and Peter McCormack. They were without Peter McColgan, who has still not fully recovered from the virus complaint which hit his performance in the world cross-country championship trial.

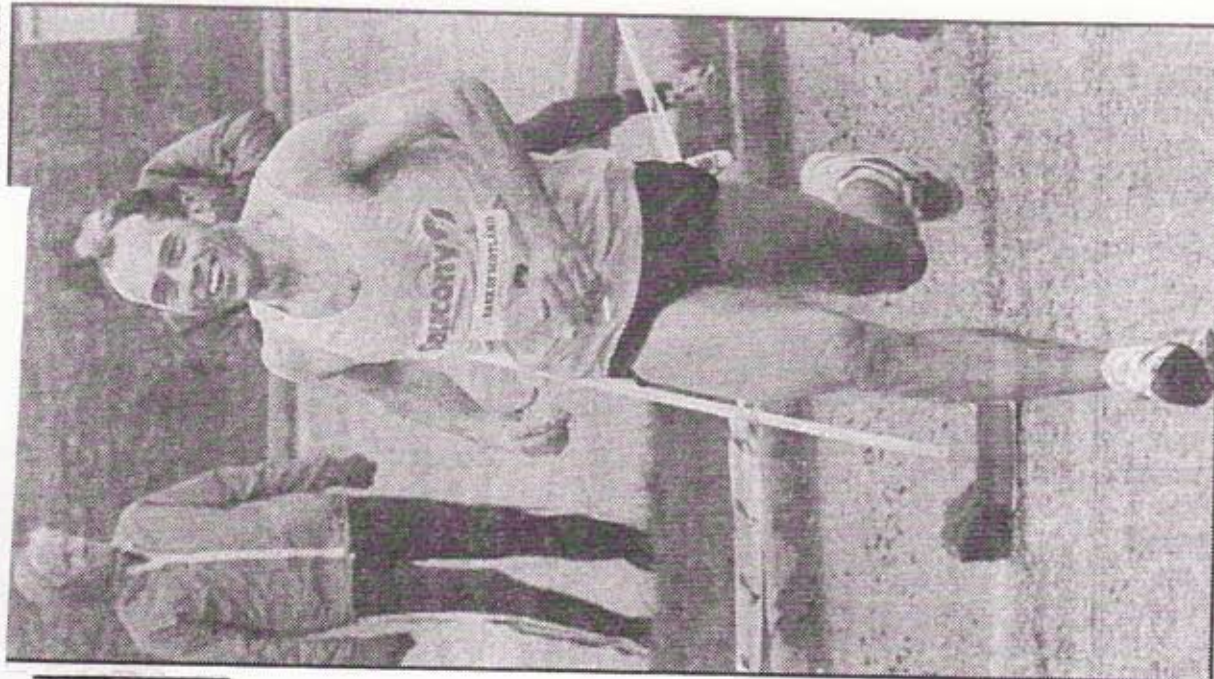
Cambuslang Harriers, the national cross-country champions, were second, 47 seconds behind Dundee.

Despite the weather, most, including Ovett, praised the course, and there is a case for staying at Livingston instead of moving the event round the country as now seems to be the policy.
