EDINBURGH NORTHERN WIN THE CROSS-COUNTRY LEAGUE.

In the fourth and last race of the season from Glinneigh Road Baths on Saturday, over a six miles course, Edinburgh Northern were successful in again possessing the winning team. W. Morris, J. L. Mackie, J. Grant, and A. G. Burns were the club's representatives, and "packing" well finished second, third, fifth, and seventh in the order named. This result gives the Northern Club the honour of leading the Cross-Country League, instituted last year, with four wins and an aggregate of 80 points.

The individual placings saw the young Southern runner, R. Paterson, take premier position for the second time this season, with the time of 39 mins. 49 secs., which, considering the heavy state of the course, was very creditable. W. Morris, F.X.II., was second with 39 mins. 57 secs., and a clubmate in J. L. Mackie took up third place in 40 mins. 5 secs., fourth, J. A. Henderson, E.S.H.

The clubs' total of points for the race resulted:—Edinburgh Northern with 17 points; Edinburgh Harriers, 43 points; Edinburgh Southern, 76 points; Heriot's C.C. Club, 104 points. The Edinburgh Northern Club are sound and convincing winners, as the result for the four runs shows:—Edinburgh Northern, 80 points; Edinburgh Harriers, 135 points; Heriot's Cross-Country Club, 296 points; Edinburgh Southern, 308 points.

Edinburgh Southern Harriers decided their club championship in conjunction with the League race, with the following result:—1, R. Paterson; 2, J. A. Henderson, 3, J. Hunter.
