## FIRST LEAGUE RUN.

The possession of such prominent performers as W. D. Paterson and R. Paterson always ensures the Edinburgh Southern Harriers achieving some prominence during the cross-country season. This was illustrated on Saturday in the first League run of the new season, when by finishing first and third respectively the two Patersons made victory possible for their team. "W. D." had to go all out to win, as one of the Canon representatives, W. Gibson, competing for the first time, was only a yard behind the winner, and about 60 yards ahead of R. Paterson.

In the country the course was a bit heavy, and made matters a trifle arduous for some of the competitors. Stamina, therefore, played a considerable part in the day's outing, and another comparative novice in P. H. Boxwell, of the University Club, showed promising ability in gaining fourth place. From the point of view of the new blood, the race was decidedly successful.

### KIRKCALDY Y.M.C.A. COMPETE IN LEAGUE RACE AT PORTOBELLO.

The first of the season's cross-country League races took place on Saturday at Portobello, when several clubs took part, with 134 runners competing. Edinburgh Southern Harriers won the first place with 31 points, Edinburgh Northern being second with 33 points, while the others finished as follows:—University, 64; Edinburgh Harriers, 66; Kirkcaldy Y.M.C.A., 80; Canon Athletic Club, 116; Heriot's, 144. The individual winners were W. D. Patterson of the Southern, with W. Gibson, Canon, a close second. The Kirkcaldy men to count with their placings were:—Braid 16, Biggar 13, Gourlay 20, and Christie 22. The next League race will take place in Kirkcaldy on 28th November, and a large turnout is expected from the city clubs. To-day's race will be the ordinary fixture at Kirkcaldy.
