## Snow Causes Postponement of Edinburgh Race.

**T**HE usual monthly race under Edinburgh League auspices had to be postponed last Saturday owing to a severe snowstorm. This race has undoubtedly grown in interest since its inception last year, when Edinburgh, Northern, Southern, and Heriot C.C.C. initiated the movement. Since the year opened the University Hares and Hounds, Canon Sports Club, and Kirkcaldy Y.M.C.A. have joined the League, thus making for all-round interest.

Mr. George Sandelands, who was a noted Scottish sprinter in R. C. Duncan's time to whom he had to concede the honour of champion on several occasions, is keenly interested in this contest—indeed, he founded the Kirkcaldy club, which came into being more than a year ago. Sandelands is a teacher by profession in the town from which the club takes its name. March 20 is the date fixed for the next race.

The fourth and last League race under East of Scotland League auspices was decided from Glenogle Baths, Edinburgh on Saturday. Fifty runners were sent on their six miles journey. W. D. Patterson, Edinburgh Southern, finished first for the fourth time, covering the distance in 36 m. 53s. R. Patterson, also of Southern, was second in 36m. 54s., and W. Morris, Edinburgh Northern, third in 36m. 57s. W. D. Patterson won Berwick's Inter-Club Run; W. Morris was 3rd, and R. Patterson, 8th.
