EDINBURGH LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP.

Under extremely bad weather conditions, the last race (six miles) for the decision of this year's championship of the Edinburgh and District Cross-Country League was run at Manselburgh. The route included running on the racecourse, with repeat excursions in the country.—All seven clubs in the League were represented, but Harrier's Cross-Country Club did not field a full team, and Kirkcaldy Y.M.C.A. did not finish with a coaching team. G. M. Grant, president of the League, was starter, and also acted with George Hume and D. Taylor as timekeepers. The referee was J. W. Dickson, president of the National Cross-Country Union. In the circumstances the times produced were good, and keen interest was displayed by runners and spectators. Result:—

1. Edinburgh Northern Harriers, 48 points; 2. Edinburgh Southern Harriers, 72 points; 3. Edinburgh Harriers, 24 points; 4. Canon Athletic Sports Club, 121 points; 5. Rover Scouts Athletic Club, 195 points.
