

# CROSS-COUNTRY LEAGUE RACE.

At Redford Barracks, Colinton, on Saturday, the Edinburgh Northern Harriers won the last of the series of Edinburgh and District League encounters. The Cameron Highlanders' team ran well, and only the fact of their last two men being so far down the course cost them the race. J. P. Wood, Harrier's Cross-Country Club, won the individual honours, as he was fully expected to do. Lieut.-Colonel McCall started close on a hundred men, who crossed the football fields and were soon in the country. At the end of the first circuit Wood was leading the field, with G. F. Lothian, E.N.H., running well some way behind. Lance-Corporal Cameron, Cameron Highlanders, was going strongly in third position, with W. Gibson, C.A.S.C., immediately at his back. Wood was the first man to appear in sight at the end of the second lap. He took the top 150 yards in front of Lance-Corporal Cameron, who did well to finish second. A. T. Armstrong, E.N.H., put in a great second lap to take third place, and G. F. Lothian fell to secure fourth position.
