

## KIRKCALDY Y.M.C.A. HARRIERS.

## EDINBURGH LEAGUE.

### NORTHERN BEAT HOLDERS.

At Portobello, on Saturday afternoon, in bright, breezy weather, with good going, the Edinburgh and District Cross-Country League concluded their season's races for the League Championship (Sandilands) shield. All the seven clubs in the League were represented. Six miles of road and field were covered and, instead of finishing, as is usual in harriers' events, at Portobello Baths, the conclusion was at St Mark's Place, where the start had been made under the orders of Councillor P. H. Allan, in presence of Thomas Jack, Edinburgh Southern Harriers, President of the Scottish Cross-Country Union, and many prominent runners of the past.

G. M. Grant, Edinburgh Northern Harriers, was time-keeper, and the veteran, George Mackenzie, Edinburgh Northern—winner of perhaps more cross-country and track amateur events than any other Scottish harrier—was referee.

This was the third race of the season, and the course included a fair section of cross-country in the out limits of Niddrie and Bruntsford. Before the race the Edinburgh Northern had a lead of 23 points from the holders, Edinburgh Southern, and these old rivals were by a good margin ahead of the other clubs. Previous to last year the Northern had scored a series of wins. The first six men of each club to finish counted for the winning aggregate of points.
