

RIVAL HARRIERS AT KIRKCALDY

EDINBURGH NORTHERN'S SUCCESS.

The concluding race of the Edinburgh District Cross Country League was held at Kirkcaldy on Saturday.

H. M'Intosh, of Edinburgh Northern, was first home, his time being 49 minutes 41 seconds. He was four seconds ahead of the Heriot's crack, John Wood.

Northern won the Sandiland's Trophy for the seventh time with 54 points.

Champions Again

At Kirkcaldy, on Saturday, Edinburgh Northern Harriers won the Edinburgh and District Cross Country League Championship for the seventh time in eight years, their only failure being in season 1929-30, when they finished third to Edinburgh Southern Harriers and Kirkcaldy Y.M.C.A. Since the inception of the race in 1924-25, the Northern have always taken a prominent part, and of the 26 races which have been decided, they have won 21, finished second three times, and been third and fourth once. They were also the first winners of the Sandilands Shield, which was presented for competition in 1927-28. In seasons 1924-25 and 1925-26 four races were decided, but since then only three races have been run each season. The most successful club is the Edinburgh Southern Harriers who, besides winning the League Championship in season 1929-30, have finished runners-up on four occasions, and third in seasons 1927-28 and 1928-29. They have also been very successful in the League races, winning three, being second 15 times, three times third, once third equal, and four times fourth.
